This couple were living at 568 Powell St. at time of declaration. Ise KITAMURA declared no property and none is referred to in her file.

Genosuke KITAMURA, reported (at 568 Powell) 3 beds, 2 stoves, 2 tables, 6 chairs, kitchen utensils on APRIL 3, 1942. On October 15, 1942, the day he was evacuated, he stated that he had no property of any kind in the protected area.

The information received from Mr. Simmons, of the Dept. of Labour, is that 35 pieces, including a sewing machine, were shipped for Mrs. Ise KITAMURA from 568 Powell St. to Slocan City, according to a memo in the Dept. of Labour records. No date was given by Mr. Simmons, but it would seem that the shipment referred to explains the change in connection with his property shown by the two reports of Genosuke KITAMURA.
