Res Torno TAJIRI, Reg. #08162 Your memorandum dealing with the estate of Manco TAJIRI again revives a question that some to me to be constantly cropping up in connection with the death of Japanese, Most of the time the first advice this office seems to got is either a claim for fineral expenses or a notice from the Insurance Company in connection with some policy. I think that there should be some definite arrangement between the B. C. Security Commission and the Administration Department, who are responsible for handling estates, by which ismediately on the death of an Evaquee the Administration Department would be advised, thereby enabling them to have the file of the deceased brought up-to-date, and meson, inserted in any other file wilds might be effected, such as a relative receiving insurance as a beneficiary. This would permit the various departments concerned to deal with the case incofer as their interest was involved before any funds which might possibly be used to take care of the deceased's debts were paid out to Beneficiaries. I have spoken to Mr. Wright about this and he is taking it up with the B. C. Security Commission; the only point there is to be sure that the Evaquee Department get advised when an Evaquee 18 effected.
