We regret to hear from the Department of Labour, Japanese Division, of the recent death of your husband, above mentioned.

It will be necessary for you, as next-of-kin, to take certain action before proceeds from your husband's estate can be disbursed. We would suggest that you either consult a Solicitor or apply direct to the Official Administrator, Mr. J. M. Streight, 713 Columbia Street, New Westminster, B. C., for the administration of the Estate.

Dear Sir:

The above noted Japanese, who prior to evacuation resided at New Westminster, B. C., died on January 11, 1946, at Slocan City, B. C., and we have been advised by his widow, Mrs. Sueno Hayashida, that she has placed the administration of his Estate in your hands, and forwarded you an itemized list of particulars in connection therewith.

According to our records, the deceased and his widow were Naturalized Canadians. We have been advised by the R.C.M.P. that the eldest children, Takeshi Hayashida, aged 24, and Hiyoaki Hayashida, aged 21, were born in Canada, and we therefore presume that the remaining six minor children were also born in this country. We believe their names, ages and addresses were included in the Memorandum of Particulars forwarded to you by Mrs. Hayashida.

The only asset of the deceased, of which we have knowledge, is a credit balance with the Custodian, amounting to \$186.10, but there may be a further small sum credited to his account from the sale of chattels.

Liabilities on file against the deceased are as follows:

1. Department of Labour, Japanese Division, account for funeral expenses - \$80.00.
2. H. Hishiguchi Company Limited - \$232.32, for merchandise supplied prior to evacuation and during the years 1940, 1941 and 1942. H. Hishiguchi Company Limited have advised us that they hold a Promissory Note, dated May 8, 1942.


