Dear Sir:-

Received your letter of April 5th. Sorry to have to borrow you with it. At the time of evacuation I said I didn't have anything because I didn't want to bother with you as I didn't think it was worth very much and as the owner of the house told me to just leave it for they would put it away for me. I could not manage it as in the condition I was with my husband been ^{away} at camp. Some of the things I had to sell to get cash for, buy the childrens clothing to come to the interior. I wanted my linoleum so I wrote to the owner some time ago but they had told me the Custodian had charge of every thing. The things you have mentioned in the letter belongs to me

and besides there were some kitchen
utensils, aluminum double boiler
which I didn't get time to pack and
also davenport chuck, wool axe. I
cannot remember everything as I just
left in the house as I could not manage
it for I left two days earlier than I had
expected so some of the men came and
helped me. I am really sorry I had
to bother you with it. I thank you
very much.
