GENERAL SUMMARY

Re: (Miss) Michiye KAI
Registration No. 15344

Michiye KAI's father, Yusuke KAI, died in Kaslo, B. C., leaving a Will but failed to name an Executor therein. The deceased made the following bequests in said Will:

"The household effects to my wife, Mrs. Tami Kai. The Shoe Repair Machinery to be divided among my five sons, namely, Isamu, Tsutomu, Mitsugu, Megumi, Susumu."

Mr. Isamu Kai was appointed Administrator by the Court under Letters of Administration dated July 27, 1943, and, therefore, proceeds received from the sale of chattels should be sent to him in that capacity. In this connection a notation was made by Mr. K. W. Wright on a memorandum dated June 8, 1944, (File No. 7843) which was in reply to a query in said memorandum. "As this man died subsequent to Evacuation you may liquidate but proceeds must be paid to the Administrator appointed by the Court and cheque should issue in capacity of Administrator and not in personal capacity. The administrator is responsible to the Court for proper distribution - payment of creditors of deceased etc."

However, as Isamu Kai wished to follow the shoe repairing business as soon as the war was over, his four brothers transferred their interest in said machinery to him. See Document on File No. 7843 dated December 30, 1944, transferring respective interest of brothers to Isamu Kai.

Miss Michiye Kai, in her 'J' Form dated May 6, 1942, declared she had no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area in B. C. However, 1 Baby Brownie Camera (127) and Case was handed to the Custodian by the R.C.M.P. on August 16, 1944. Miss Kai wrote for this camera on October 14, 1945, and after sending in the R.C.M.P. receipt and postage, we forwarded said camera to her at Toronto, Ontario, on December 10, 1945.

The above Camera may be the same one as declared by her brother, Mr. Mitsugi KAI, File No. 7693, but which was not found with his other effects.

NO PROPERTY INTEREST, OTHER THAN THE ABOVE-MENTIONED ARE FOUND ON THIS FILE.

Dear Madam:

In reply to your request for the return of your camera, we wish to advise that this camera will be returned if you will send us the receipt which you received at the time the camera was surrendered (this is required as proof of ownership) and also send us the sum of 50 cents to cover mailing costs.

The actual cost of mailing is generally considerably less than 50 cents, but cameras differ in weight. Any portion of the 50 cents remaining after shipping costs are paid, will be returned to you.

Dear Madam:

This is to advise that we mailed your camera to you on December 10th by insured parcel post. Postage amounted to 14 cents and packing cost was 5 cents, leaving a balance of 31 cents to be returned to you from the 50 cents which you sent to us to cover the cost of shipping your camera. We enclose 31 cents in stamps.

In your declaration to the Custodian in May, 1942, you stated that you owned no property of any kind in the protected area. Your camera was reported to this office by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police to whom you had surrendered it. Your file reveals no other property of any kind in the protected area.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area and in order that you may confirm this, and acknowledge receipt of the camera and the enclosed 31 cents, we are attaching a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
