Because this boat was leaking the authorities decided to beach it. In lifting it with a cable slung amidship it is understood damage was sustained. The boat being old the authorities decided that the cost of repairing the damage would be out of proportion to the value of the boat. and in compensation have agreed to take it over for \$400.00. Acting on instructions declarant signed two copies of a sales agreement, attached thereto the boat's license and delivered these documents to the Representative of the authorities. The \$400.00 has not yet been received by the declarant.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Tetsunosuke YAMASHITA #08703

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on May 7, 1942. The only item of property declared was a gas boat.

This vessel, known as the "T.Y" or "Nana", Nanaimo Licence No. 592, was damaged while in the custody of Naval Service, and was declared a constructive total loss. YAMASHITA agreed to accept the sum of \$400.00 in full settlement of his claim for the loss of his vessel. The sum of \$393.50, being the agreed settlement less \$6.50 to cover the supervision charges of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee, was paid in to the Custodian through the Department of Fisheries, and this sum was placed to the credit of Tetsunosuke YAMASHITA.

From these funds the Custodian has remitted to YAMASHITA the sum of \$193.50. The sum of \$35.00 was transferred to the account of Yoshitaro HARAGUCHI in settlement of a claim as authorized by YAMASHITA. The sum of \$165.00 is standing to the credit of Tetsunosuke YAMASHITA in Custodian Account at this date.


Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:

Your letter of May 22nd has been received and we have noted your comments in regard to the manner in which payment of your indebtedness of \$35.00 to Mr. Haraguchi was handled.

According to information given to this office, Mr. Haraguchi has applied for voluntary repatriation to Japan, and in the case of all such persons it has been necessary to set a deadline beyond which no funds can be remitted from their accounts with this office.

The funds to the credit of Mr. Haraguchi will be subject to the usual arrangements made with the Department of Labour at the time of his departure for Japan. If it should happen that Mr. Haraguchi's plans are changed in regard to his repatriation, we will get in touch with Mr. Haraguchi in regard to his funds.

We regret that it has not been possible to send this money to Mr. Haraguchi as he requested at the time he reported this claim to us, but the delay in receiving a reply from you in regard to this debt contributed to the result.

Though I am in receipt of your letter saying that you already sent \$35.00 to settle my debt to Mr. Yoshitaro HARAGUCHI, of New Denver, B. C., I learned Mr. Haraguchi has not yet received the same.

You know the first deportation boat, which I am taking, leaves Vancouver on 31st of this month. All the necessary preparations, such as inspection of baggage, exchange of currency, etc., will be done during 15, 16, 17th of this month. Before I leave Canada, I want to know definitely and wish to obtain a letter or a receipt from Mr. Haraguchi.

Till this date, you have not yet sent this sum to Mr. Haraguchi. I am very anxious to have this debt settled. You hold money in my credit. Why is the delay? Probably this is the last letter I can write to you. Please look after this matter right away, and let me sail off Canada in peace.

A letter from Mr. K. Kimura regarding proceeds of your fishing vessel, the "T. Y.", has been passed on to this department for attention.

The vessel was declared a Constructive Total Loss and a claim was filed with the Government. Payment of this claim, in the sum of \$393.50, has recently come to hand from Ottawa, and has been placed to the credit of your account.

We note your need of funds and enclose our cheque for \$100.00, the maximum we can remit in any one month under our present policy of conserving cash assets in order to make them available over as long a period of time as possible.

We are prepared to send you regular monthly remittances within the above-mentioned limit, so long as funds on hand permit, and if you will let us know the minimum amount that would meet your needs we will see that this sum is remitted regularly until the balance standing at your credit is used up.

After making the above remittance, the balance carried forward will be \$293.50.
