PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY File No. 8029 May 18, 1946. Res Chikae KAWAHARA, #09161 This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on May 7, 1942. She was evacuated on September 15, 1942. In her declaration she reported chattels left at the Japanese Community Hall, Paldi. Chattels left at this hall were not inventoried. shipments were made from there by the May Lumber Company and finally s of saleable nature which had not been returned to the owners, west goods of saleable nature which had sold at anction by the Custodian. In the case of the chattels reported on this file, many of the same articles were declared by her husband, File 12386, and the items that were sold were credited to his account; the net proceeds being \$12.37. The items declared by this woman and sold by the Custodian were one bed, one dresser and 3 chairs. She declared 2 boxes of kitchen utensils, one box of tools, 2 boxes of dry goods and one piece of linoleum. Three boxes (contents unknown) one tool box and a sewing machine were shipped to her in August, 1942. A carton mas shipped in September, 1942. A piece of lineleus was, according to stelleuse on the husband's file, shipped to him in March, 1943. Shipments and sale apparently account for everything declared except one bed, and in all probability this bed was discarded as valueless. This file reveals no other property of any kind.

Shipments were mide to you at your request in August and Sep tember, 1942 and in March, 1943. The saleable articles remaining were sold at anotion by this office for the not sum of \$12.77, which was credited to the account of Mr. KAMARARA. A refund of one per cent wage deductions for the year 1941 was received from the Provinced Covernment, and this return, assumbing to Buckly, and residence to the Edwards on March 25, 1943. A claim was filed against you on behalf of Dre. Bloost, Watson, Monaffile & Boover-Poths for the sum of \$15,00. Although this claim was referred to you you did not asknowledge our lotters. As far as this office is aware this claim is still unpaid. It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area, which vested in the todien and in order that you may confirm this we enclose & stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
