PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 8029

May 18, 1946.

Re: Chikae KAWAHARA, #09161

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on May 7, 1942. She was evacuated on September 15, 1942.

In her declaration she reported chattels left at the Japanese Community Hall, Paldi. Chattels left at this hall were not inventoried, shipments were made from there by the May Lumber Company and finally goods of saleable nature which had not been returned to the owners, were sold at auction by the Custodian.

In the case of the chattels reported on this file, many of the same articles were declared by her husband, File 12386, and the items that were sold were credited to his account; the net proceeds being \$12.37.

The items declared by this woman and sold by the Custodian were one bed, one dresser and 3 chairs.

She declared 2 boxes of kitchen utensils, one box of tools, 2 boxes of dry goods and one piece of linoleum. Three boxes (contents unknown) one tool box and a sewing machine were shipped to her in August, 1942. A carton was shipped in September, 1942. A piece of linoleum was, according to Release on the husband's file, shipped to him in March, 1943.

Shipments and sale apparently account for everything declared except one bed, and in all probability this bed was discarded as valueless.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

Dear Sir & Madam:

Your files with this office have been reviewed and it is noted that you declared household and personal effects left at Paldi.

Shipments were made to you at your request in August and September, 1942 and in March, 1943. The saleable articles remaining were sold at auction by this office for the net sum of \$12.37, which was credited to the account of Mr. KAWAHARA.

A refund of one per cent wage deductions for the year 1941 was received from the Provincial Government, and this refund, amounting to \$4.06, was remitted to Mr. KAWAHARA on March 26, 1943.

A claim was filed against you on behalf of Drs. Bisset, Watson, McHaffie & Beaver-Potts for the sum of \$15.00. Although this claim was referred to you you did not acknowledge our letters. As far as this office is aware this claim is still unpaid.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area, which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

Replying to your letter of September 21st re Minoru
Adachi, #09038.

We beg to advise that the Japanese formerly living here stored their household goods in the Japanese Hall at Paldi, but just what was stored in this hall, the Company has no way of knowing, as we were not given a list or a record of each individual's personal property.

The understanding with Mr. T. Urabe, the Japanese Foreman while working for this Company, was that they could store their chattels in the hall and we would ship out anything they ordered, if it was possible. Since then, we have shipped considerable items to them as per instructions from your office. Records of which we have here. But as to what is left in the hall, we have no record.

We shipped for M. Adachi six pieces as per your order dated July 27th signed by Mr. J. A. Rose of the B. C. Security Commission.
