In reviewing your files and registration forms we find the following unsettled claims against you. We are addressing this letter to the both of you as there seems some confusion as to the application of some of these claims. They are as follows:

1. Canadian Bank of Commerce, 1690 Commercial Drive - \$276.40.  
Our records show that a promissory note for that amount was forwarded to Mr. Furuya for his signature and return sometime ago, but that it was not returned.
2. H. Tagashira & Co. - \$646.48.  
This claim is filed against both of you, and is directed to 701 Burrard Street where you apparently were in business as "Georgia Confectionery", according to the registration form of Mrs. Furuya.
3. Vancouver General Hospital - \$216.90.  
This is a judgment against Mr. Furuya according to a letter by E.A. Burnett, Barrister, acting for the Hospital in this case.
4. P.C. Gibbens and Co. Ltd. - \$60.00.  
(Agent for Arthur Nelson)  
This is for rent at 904 E. Hastings Street from April 29th to July 29th, 1942.
5. Dr. G.F. Strong - \$42.90.  
This is in the form of a judgment according to claim filed on his behalf by Messrs. Woodworth and Woodworth Limited.

The foregoing brings these files up to date, and this letter is forwarded at this time to clarify the file and ascertain from you if these claims are correct or otherwise. If correct, what arrangements are you making for the payment of them?

Each of them requires special attention and reply, and we are asking that you let us have your answer promptly.

In brief this will confirm our discussion during the course of which we informed you that we have no assets under our control belonging to Mrs. Hamakichi Furuya and in consequence, in the light of the information now on file, believe that prospects of settling your claim are very small indeed.

We have, however, called this case to the attention of the British Columbia Security Commission with the suggestion that they take any action which they may deem advisable under the circumstances. We are also endeavouring to obtain the registration of Mr. Hamakichi Furuya and should we discover any assets belonging to the Furuya family we shall be glad to get in touch with you at that time. You will, of course, recall our statement to you that we have on file other claims against Mr. Furuya amounting to approximately \$300.00.

We have received a complaint from Arthur Nelson of 1001 West Pender Street, Vancouver regarding the tenants in his property at 904 East Hastings Street, Vancouver.

In brief, Mr. Harry Furuya has been evacuated to Camp B 12, Tete Jaune, B. C. and his wife, Mrs. Hamakichi Furuya, and her two sons are still occupying the premises. Rent is payable at the rate of \$20.00 per month and there is a balance owing for unpaid rent to August 1st amounting to \$60.00. Our file indicates that there are other claims for about \$300.00 against Mr. Furuya and the declaration form we have reveals no liquid assets.

As Mr. Nelson is anxious to have these premises available for rental purposes we are drawing this case to your attention for any action you deem advisable in the circumstances.
