The above who registered May 7, 1942 was evacuated May 19, 1942. He declared: 1 Electric Washer at 2087 East King Edward, Vancouver. This was sold to G. L. Sather for \$75.00 with UYENAKA's approval and proceeds remitted to him on August 30, 1943.

1 Singer Sewing Machine and 2 Beds at the Seventh Day Adventist Church, 10th and Yukon Streets, Vancouver. These two articles were shipped to UYENAKA as per letter from G. L. Sather, on file, dated May 6, 1943.

5 Boxes of clothing & effects left with Mr. H. Barclay, 2940 East 1st. Ave., Vancouver. These were shipped to UYENAKA as per letter on file dated May 6, 1943 from Mr. G. L. Sather.

The foregoing articles originated in Woodfibre.

He declared 1 stove in care of the church caretaker at 201 Abbott Street. It is assumed this article was shipped to him within the 5 boxes but not specifically mentioned. This will be clarified in our letter to him.

The Electric Motor disclosed in a letter from Mr. G. L. Sather, June 29, 1943, was not declared. It was recovered and sold for \$10.00, the price approved by UYENAKA.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES:

Whilst he did not declare a radio, Mr. G. L. Sather in his letter on file, dated June 29, 1943 mentions that he bought a radio from UYENAKA.

SHARES:

There is a reference on file dated January 12, 1944, that Kyuzo UYENAKA was a shareholder in the UYENAKA EXPORT CO. LTD. This did not come under control of the Custodian.

This can only be used with direct current and along the Coast where they have the small electric plants.

I am leaving today for the United States and have been unable to do anything with this motor. I will leave it here at the B. C. Conference office, 234 West 13th Ave. with a label attached, indicating that it is the property of K. Uyenaka of Picture Butte, Alta. and that if it is sold the proceeds should be passed over to your department to be forwarded on to Mr. Uyenaka. Thank you for your letter with reference to Mr. and Mrs.
H. Okamura and Mr. K. Uyenaka. I am enclosing a cheque in
your favor for the balance due on the Electric Washer. You
will notice that we have deducted for freight and cartage
that we paid on the recent shipment of household goods, of
which you already have a record.

I am also enclosing some letters from K. Uyenaka, authorizing
the sale of the washer, but I do not seem to have his original
letter authorizing the sale of the radio. The reason for this
is that the radio was left in the hands of Kelly's Music Store
and he apparently had it in mind to lose his equity in it, which
was \$48.00. However, I felt that this was altogether too low
a price for the radio so I offered him \$75.00 and bought it
at this price a year ago.

The only thing that Mr. Uyenaka has here in Vancouver now to
my knowledge, is a direct-current Electric Motor, the one he
used for the washer while at Woodfibre, B. C. I suggested that
he endeavour to sell it for \$10.00. Since I will be leaving
for the United States in a couple of weeks I had better bring
this motor down to you. I shall do this as soon as I return
from Kelowna where I will be for the next few days.
