Dear Mr. Wright:

Re: T. Buck Suzuki - B-90180

I am in receipt of your letter of the 9th instant in which you
enclose copy of a letter received by the Hon. Paul Martin from Premier
T.C. Douglas. The letter indicates that certain property owned by the
above has been sold.

We have a registration under date 5th May 1942, signed by George
Tadatoshi Suzuki, Registration #02287, giving his address at that time as
1537 West 3rd Avenue and aged 20.

We received a letter dated October 15th, 1945 from Sgt. G.D.T.
Suzuki, B.90183, G.S.I., I.F.B.U., Dett. H.G. 34th Indian Corps.,
S.E.A.C. India (Malaya), C.A.O.

You will note that the description is B.90183 and the caption
to your letter is B-90180. Although the names are not identical we presume
this is the party to whom reference is now being made.

There does not appear to be any real property involved. Suzuki
declared ownership to a 10 tube Westinghouse radio and a 35 m. Kodak which
he had left with a Mr. Wells residing at West 8th Avenue, Vancouver. This
man was finally located and in July 1943 confirmed that he had been holding
a 10 tube Westinghouse radio and Kodak, also one large mirror, 4 boxes, one
carton, one trunk, one wall clock. He stated, however, that the Kodak had
been mailed East the previous year.

On July 10th, 1943, Suzuki wrote from 418 Richmond Street, London,
Ontario, confirming that the camera had been received by him.

The letter of October 15th, 1945, referred to above, asked for
the release to his brother, L.T. Suzuki, of the following:

K. W. Wright, Esq.

1 Radio
1 trunk
4 Boxes
1 Carton
1 wall clock
1 full length mirror

A letter was written to Pte. L.T.Suzuki confirming this release.

Mr. Chas. Wells has informed this office by telephone that Pte. L.T. Suzuki has taken delivery of the Westinghouse radio. He still retains the mirror, wall clock, trunk, boxes and cartons, most of which he states contains junk, the residue of a Drycleaning business in which this family was formerly interested.

In this connection I note that the father, Toshizo Paul Suzuki operated as a tailor in rented premises. The father has a small credit on our books of \$4.30, the proceeds of a few articles taken from the rented premises against which, however, Toshizo Suzuki has an admitted debt of \$44.-

This seems to be all the information which we can supply.



I have communicated with Mr. Charles E. Wells mentioned in this file, and he informed me by telephone that Pte. L.F. SUZUKI presented our delivery order to him and obtained the Westinghouse radio.

Pte. SUZUKI had no immediate use for the mirror, wall clock, or the trunk, boxes and cartons, most of which contained junk and residue of the dry cleaning establishment formerly maintained by this family, and these were allowed to remain in the care of Mr. Wells pending future decision regarding disposal.
