Dear Sir:

Thank you for your letter of March 24th.

Until such time as you have either been evacuated or have entrusted us with your property, you are entirely free to store, sell or dispose of it in accordance with your own wishes.

You are also at liberty, if you so desire, and at your own expense, to bring down to Vancouver any of your own movable property which you may desire. Following your evacuation and/or registration, your remaining property vests in the Custodian, who is empowered to take any steps deemed suitable for the protection of your interests.

Any property which may remain in your house at Woodfibre should be padlocked, the key left with a local individual trusted by you and complete particulars should be provided by you at the time of your registration.

Dear Sir -

I reside in Woodfibre and I
would appreciate greatly if you could inform
me as to what policy is taken regarding personal
property. I have read your paid advertisements in
the daily papers regarding the same but do not
comprehend some points. I understand that in
the event of general evacuation ~~from~~ from this community
we are to leave property, ^(not ours) packed in our residence.
Now we live here on company property in rented
houses. In such cases does the Custodian still have
responsibility over my personal belongings as
furniture & so forth.

Secondly, upon evacuation, if I so desired
to ship my personal belongings to place in the
hands of the Custodian in Vancouver, am I able
to do so? - and at what's whose expense?

I understand the Custodian is vested with
powers to dispose of such property in ways
as he sees fit - now is this done with the
owners knowledge & consent?

If one does not desire to place such personal property as household goods in the Custodian's hand is he at liberty to store, sell or dispose of same as he wishes?

Also if possible could you advise me as to what problems would be best to take.

I await your immediate reply.
