PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

July 22, 1946.

Re: George Yoichi YANO, Registration No. 08944

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on May 8, 1942. He was evacuated on September 26, 1942.

In his declaration he reported 20 pieces of effects left at the Japanese Hall, Duncan B.C. He requested shipment of most of these articles and we assume they were shipped to him. The remainder were sold at auction and the net proceeds of \$3.36 were credited to his account. This amount is today being forwarded to Drs. Bissett, Watson, McHffie & Beevor-Potts to be applied on their claim against this man, which YANO admitted.

He reported a Manufacturers Life policy for \$1,500.00 in his own possession. This did not come under the control of this office.



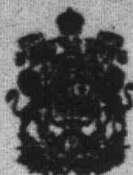

one box of household goods, 170 lbs., with the following charges:

It appears from the bill of lading that Mr. Bossons did the billing
as well as the packing, and we wish to call your attention to the
fact that the charges of your Agent for releasing this box was over
1/2 a lb. The total charges to the freight shed were \$4.00.

Contrast this with shipment made recently from a farm
in the Surrey Hill district out from New Westminster for SUZUKI
of one washing machine, two 100 lb. sacks of beans, one Coleman
stove, a total of 415 lbs., picked up by a truck line and brought
to Vancouver and shipped, a total charge of \$2.50.

This is called to your attention as a condition existing
at several outlying points from which goods of Japanese have to be
shipped.
