PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: YOSHIDA, Hina(Mrs. Tomekichi) - Reg. No. 08549.

Mrs. YOSHIDA signed a declaration to the Custodian on May 9, 1942 and was evacuated on September 8, 1942.

CHATELS: She declared chattels stored on the property of Mr. Gihei KAWAHARA, Chemainus. These have all been shipped to her and her husband except for 7 chairs sold in auction Sale Chemainus 1, for the net sum of \$2.38 and a box of books, stored at 604 East Cordova Street in the name of her husband, Tomekichi YOSHIDA, File 12347 (Inventory 736).

A few household goods and 2 tables were sold in Auction Chemainus 1, but as they were not declared by either Mr. or Mrs. YOSHIDA, the proceeds, \$8.50 have been transferred to Chattel Suspense Account.

She also declared 3 double beds, 1 box books, 1 box of sundries stored in the basement of the Tunstall Building, 709 Dunsmuir St., Vancouver, B.C in the care of Mr. Bradford, H. A. Roberts Ltd. We contacted Mr. Bradford in October 1946, and he advised that 2 3/4 beds and 4 boxes of sundries consisted the items stored. These were moved and sold by Auction for the net sum of \$6.70. 3 Springs and 3 mattresses were discarded as being valueless. It would seem that the two beds which were sold did not include springs and mattresses, these having been discarded and that Mrs. YOSHIDA at some time prior to her evacuation sold the third bed, leaving the spring and mattress, now discarded.

One sleigh and 40 lbs of rice were shipped in July 1942 and in November 1942, both undeclared.

This file reveals no property other than that declared above.
