RE: 285 Heatley Ave.

The position as regards chattels is very confused. We had some difficulty with Mr. Tagashira when the disposition of the chattels came up for attention. He removed a considerable quantity of things to public storage, and later several truck loads were discovered by us in the attic, and later in the basement (Heatley Trading Co.) and these were moved to auction on three occasions. Without identification, we were obliged to sell everything under the name of R. TAGASHIRA (File No. 5129/2).

When everything is completed, it will be necessary to send copies of the proceeds of auctions to all persons who lived or roomed in the TAGASHIRA premises and have them identify their own chattels.

We have your letter of the 1st instant with copy of letter received from Mr. Tagashira.

We note that you have sent him release forms, and hope he will follow the customary prescribed procedure.

On his visit to Vancouver we endeavoured to solve his problems regarding the disposal of all chattels left in his care, but he was not helpful, on the contrary, he was very arbitrary and independent, and any confusion that may have resulted is entirely his responsibility.
