Whether this was done when the form was signed or afterwards is not mentioned.

Dr. H. UCHIDA'S claim for \$70.00 was withdrawn 9th August, 1943.

The claims of Dr. NISHIMURA - \$100.00, and KANEDA BROS. LTD. - \$50.00 are not mention in Isami KUNITOMO'S file. The only claims he has authorized the Custodian to pay are the following, which were paid by cheque 29th August, 1943:

There is a copy of a letter on Mrs. Isami KUNITOMO'S file 8276, written by A. McCallister of the Claims Dept., which reads as follows: "On the registration form which you filed with the Custodian you show the following personal debts:

There is also a memorandum dated August 15th, 1944, signed by Mr. Best with reference to File 13794, which states: "There are no claims on file to date". There is also a copy of a letter to Mr. Isami KUNITOMO, dated July 3rd, 1944, the last paragraph reads as follows: "According to our files there are now no claims outstanding against you, and perhaps you will please confirm this at an early date".

Unless you reply to our letters we will tell the Singer Sewing Machine Co. to take any action they may see fit.

We would also draw your attention to the fact that you are liable to severe penalties as laid down in the "Consolidated Regulations Respecting Trading with the Enemy", if you do not reply to correspondence addressed to you by the Custodian.
