
Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:

The wife declared nothing but had shipped to her in May 1942 four pieces from the Hillcrest Lumber Company. These clearly represent the four items declared by the husband and these files may, therefore, be regarded as closed insofar as personal effects are concerned.

His refund of 1% wage deduction is being sent to the husband as the only claim on file is for 20¢ from M. Furuya & Company which our Claims Dept. advise may be ignored.
