PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Mrs. Itsuki FUJINO, Reg. No. 07092

This woman in her declaration to the Custodian, May 7, 1942, stated that she owned no property in the protected area. However, the household effects which were declared by her husband have been administered partly on the file of her husband and partly on the file of Mrs. FUJINO. A copy of the chattel schedule which has been placed on the file of her husband is filed behind this summary.

Articles identified as the property of Mrs. FUJINO were sold at auction on May 31, 1944 and the net proceeds were placed to her credit in the amount of \$9.28.

A large quantity of the chattels belonging to this couple were released to Mrs. FUJINO. A wardrobe trunk, carrying the name I. FUJINO was stored at 992 Powell Street on May 31, 1944.

The household effects declared by Mr. Itsuki FUJINO, administered in part on his wife's file, were the only items of property revealed on this file.

Dear Sir and Madam:

Your files with this office have been reviewed, and it is noted that, in your declarations to the Custodian, you reported ownership of a quantity of furniture and other personal effects. The greater part of these chattels were released to Mrs. FUJINO before she left the protected area. A wardrobe trunk identified as your property is in storage here. The saleable articles remaining were sold at auction for the net sum of \$9.28, which has been credited to your account.

The sum of \$14.45 has been credited to the account of Mr. FUJINO in full settlement of the claim filed by him with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for refund of expenses incurred at the time of the impounding of the vessel "I.F.",

The vessel "I.F.", also known as the "L.F." and "Miss Florida" was sold by Mr. FUJINO through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee and the net proceeds of \$445.50 were paid to him on March 25, 1942.

The Victory Bond and Life Insurance Policy declared by Mr. FUJINO did not come under the control of this office.

Your files show that you are indebted to Matsujiro UHASHI, of Fort Rosington, for the sum of \$500.00. We have no record that this debt has been paid, and therefore are unable to remit to you the funds standing to your credit with this office.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area, which vested in the Custodian, and, in order that you may confirm this, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
