However on April 20/43 she wrote asking Custodian Release form so that she might have the following goods shipped to her from 943 Leifer St.

2 double beds
8 chairs
1 small box of plain plates

One bed and 8 chairs were sold on the file of her husband. One bed and the box of plates were not found. Full details of the chattels are given on the file of the husband, File 8040.

There are no claims on file against Mrs. NAKASHIMA.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

With further reference to memorandum of April 26th, the file of Seitaro Sugamori (11268) shows that we are having great difficulty in identifying the various belongings left at 943 Keefer Street. The correspondence is under way on file 11268 and other files, but will probably not produce any satisfactory results.

From letter of April 30th, 1943, on file 8040, and April 30th, 1943, on file 8414, it appears that the only effects belonging to these Japanese left at 943 Keefer Street are follows.

- 2 Double beds (no mattresses)
- 1 Small box of plain plates
- 8 Kitchen chairs

Reference to the auction list of April 18th on file 11268 shows sale of various beds, a carton of crockery, and eighteen kitchen chairs so that it is quite probable that the effects of these evacuees are included in the auction sale of Seitaro Sugamori's belongings, the proceeds of which have been frozen until the position is finally clarified.
