Mr. Miller of the Administration Trust Co., 404 Hornby - Pacific 5271, phoned this morning in connection with Y. HAKKAKU, who owes some

- \$50 for rent in arrears on ^{rented} 239 Main St., presently occupied by his wife & daughter. He himself has already been evacuated, and as far as our records show there are no liquid assets available. In order to reimburse themselves to some extent the Administration

- Trust were proposing to seize & sell such personal property as may exist at 239 Main. I pointed out

that such seizure could not be
executed without our approval, &
later checked with Mr. McPherson, &
that statement was correct.

Mr. McPherson also suggested that
in a case like this we should first
confirm with Miss Carol (Mr. Reed's office)
that the man has no bank account,
(I did this & he hasn't one known to us)
and if not, I was told the best thing
to do would be to send one of our
people (ex. Powell St.) to inspect what
belongings these people have and
report to us whether they would be
worth selling to liquidate the debts.

● If not, the creditors would appear
to be out of luck. It is also suggested
to the Security Commission should be

asked to move the wife & daughter
to Hastings Park unless the arrears of
rent can be paid up & current rent
met. Alternative eviction?

I regret I have not been able to
arrange for inspection of the personal
effects.

Miller says that the wife mentioned
expecting to receive \$20 per month ex
her husband's earnings at the Road
Camp.

I have told Miller to file a claim
we will see what can be done to have
the Japanese pay it off gradually ex
his monthly earnings.
