"Kindly advise them when done. If Mr. Kenyon wishes, he may send both copies of the Bill of Lading to us and we will send the original on to the Inouyes or he may mail the original direct."

Finally, the writer would like to take this opportunity of thanking Mr. Kenyon for the courtesy shown him on his recent visit to your end and for the assistance you have extended to us and the Security Commission.
