Two tubs of this Soya sauce was sold and the amount of \$16.00 was credited to this woman's account. The wool was sent to Mrs. NAKATA and the cost of shipping, \$2.25, was debited to this account. The belance of the refunds are being transferred to Account No. 8008; This file reveals no other property of any kind. This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.
