GENERAL SUMMARY

Yukiyo (Mrs. Masanobu) NAKAMURA

Reg. #11101.

This 22-year old Canadian-born Housewife from Port Essington, signed a Custodian "No Property" card on the 9th May, 1942. She was evacuated on the 22nd June, 1942.

Her husband, Masanobu (File 7653), signed a Custodian "JP" declaration form on the 4th May, 1942. He was evacuated on the 17th May, 1942.

The following is a summary of the contents of this file as disclosed by a review made today.

Real Property: None.

Personal Property: This evacuee declared no chattels, all being carried in husband's file (7653). Two tons of coal, sold June 26/43, was treated as jointly owned, the proceeds (\$20.00) being credited to a Joint Account in the names of this evacuee and her husband (7653/8497).

A Buddhist Shrine and box of Clothing referred to in this evacuee's letter of 4th August, 1943, are both dealt with in husband's file, where they are shown as having been shipped on August 17th, 1943.

Specified Articles: Net proceeds (\$25.36) from auction sale of a radio set was credited to the Joint Account in names of this evacuee and her husband. A Declaration Form, dated June 23/47, (in lieu of lost radio receipt) is on both files.

Bills Receivable: None.

Bonds, Shares, etc.: None.

Bank Accounts: None.

Life Insurance: None.

Liabilities: There are no claims recorded in this file.

Funds: The balance of \$45.36 in Joint Account is today being remitted to this husband and wife, and the account closed.

These files are up for review and we find that both the Personal Account of Mr. Nakamura and the Joint Account in your joint names, are inactive and should therefore be closed.

The balance standing at the credit of Mr. Nakamura's account is \$17.36, made up of net proceeds (\$12.36) from an auction sale of chattels, as per enclosed auction sheet, and refund of transportation expenses (\$5.00) connected with delivery of the fishing vessel, "Silver Queen". As no further entries are expected we are enclosing our cheque in favour of Masanobu NAKAMURA for \$17.36, and closing this account.

The balance standing at the credit of the Joint Account in the names of Masanobu and Yukiyo NAKAMURA is \$45.36, made up of proceeds (\$20.00) from sale of coal (2 tons @ \$10.00), and net proceeds (\$25.36) from sale of a radio set, as per auction sheet enclosed herewith. It is the practice of this office to have on file original police receipt for cameras and radios before releasing the proceeds from sale of such articles, and if you will send your radio receipt we shall be pleased to mail you a cheque for the balance of this account. If the receipt has been lost we will send you a statutory declaration to be signed in lieu thereof.

We desire to have your acknowledgment of today's remittance for our records and for your convenience in replying we enclose a stamped addressed envelope.
