This file reveals that Mrs. NAKASHIBA owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS: Mrs. NAKASHIBA registered with the Custodian on May 8/42 and was evacuated on June 29/42. She signed a yellow "No property" card stating that she owned no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area of B.C. However on Feb. 1/43 we received a Custodian Release asking for shipment of 2 trunks of clothing said to be in the care of Mr. C.P. Starck, 3191 W. 38th Ave., Vancouver. On March 23/43 another Custodian Release was sent asking for shipment of one box of carpenter's tools left with the same person. As she has not written further regarding these goods we may assume the shipments were made as requested.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES: On Mar. 9/42 Mrs. NAKASHIBA surrendered the following radios to the R.C.M.P.

- 1 Sperton radio

These were turned over to the Custodian on Feb. 17/44 and sold at auction for the total net sum of \$41.62 and this sum credited to the account of Mrs. NAKASHIBA with this office. This is her only credit with the Custodian.

Chattels on these files appear to be fairly well cared for as a list of items rented with the house at 1748 West 1st appears on file on or about June 27th. The inventory of the furniture in use has apparently been signed by the tenant, Mrs. Foley, on Macaulay, Nicolls, Maitland & Company's files --- see theirs of June 18th --- while the items left locked in the basement would appear from Mrs. Foley's letter of July 3rd to be probably in order. Since then, a piano formerly loaned to a friend, has been returned to 1748 West 1st and signed for by Mrs. Foley.

On February 4th, the husband mentions that he is having some trunks stored with Mr. Starck of 3191 West 38th sent to him. Apparently there are some other items in storage at the same place and the wife has subsequently applied for shipment of a box of carpenter tools stored there. It is unnecessary at this stage to investigate further, the remaining items, if any, left with Mr. Starck.
