Consideration \$150.00 paid. Rental for 1943 and subsequent years to be \$75.00. House and buildings included. The above lease was revived by Lease No. 389 to Josephine Rodenbush on 15th March, 1943 for a term of 9 months from 1st February, 1943 to 31st October, 1943. Consideration \$75.00 on 31st July, 1943, no Taxes. Space reserved for storing chattels.
Both leases handed to The Director, The Veterans' Land Act 12th August 1943 and the \$75.00 being 1943 rentals was collected direct by The Director, The Veterans' Land Act.

SOLD: To The Director, The Veterans' Land Act for \$1178.00 as at 1st January 1943.
Approval of Advisory Committee - 1st June, 1943.
Funds released to the credit of Sakie TAKASAKI as at April 17th, 1944, against which were the following charges: Registration Fees-\$3.00, Legal Fees -\$15.00, Tax Arrears-\$43.82 = \$61.82, leaving a net credit of \$1,116.18 from said transaction.

When registering with this office, the above Japanese declared no personal or trade debts.

The Maple Ridge Co-operative cancelled 17 of TAKASAKI's shares to pay off his debt with them and they remitted the balance of 33¢ to this office where it was credited to Rikimatsu TAKASAKI's account. However in view of the fact that the property was in his wife, Sakie's name (File No. 8710). These funds together with rentals collected were transferred to his wife's account File NO. 8710.

These claims were admitted by the Japanese, although they only wished to pay the Vancouver General Hospital \$80.00. The Hospital reduced their accounts to \$135.00, and the Royal Columbian Hospital to \$102.00, and upon Mrs. TAKASAKI's authorisation of the 7th September, 1944, the accounts were all paid, from her account on the 15th September, 1944.

CHATELS:

This Japanese, on her "JP" Form of May 8/42 declared in general terms, to have left certain chattels at her residence at 2943 Dewdney Trunk Rd., Haney B. C. The key to the house in which they were stored was left with a neighbour, Mr. J. H. Curtin. (see his letter of Sep. 2/42).

On December 4/42 our fieldmen, Messrs Carlson and Anderson inventoried the chattels, and later a further inventory was made by Mr. Moryson, of this office, on February 24/43. This second inventory shows only about one third of the number of articles appearing on that of December 4/42. No comments are on file regarding the differences.

Mr. Moryson valued the chattels at "approximately \$25.00" and had a copy signed by the lessor.

There is no evidence on file of the ultimate disposition of these chattels and there is record only of the sale of 1 cultivator and 1 mail box.

A perusal of the inventories taken by our Representative, shows that many of the articles were home-made, old, and of little or no value.

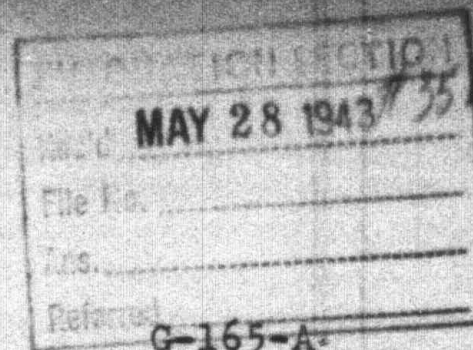

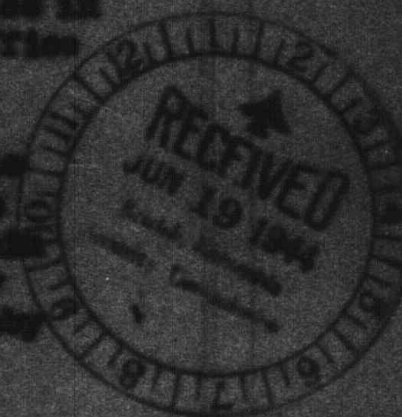

Further to the various letters which have passed between the Custodian's office and yourself with regard to the following claims which have been lodged against you:

1. Vancouver General Hospital a/c Rikimatsu	\$ 60.65
2. Vancouver General Hospital a/c son Jun, age 6 yrs. .	166.35
3. Dr. L. Broe a/c Rikimatsu and Sakie	15.00
4. Royal Columbian Hospital a/c Rikimatsu	204.75
5. Shotaro HAKAMURA a/c Sakie	2.78
6. Asataro TAKASAKI a/c Sakie	600.00

We have received a letter dated the 20th of July from the B.C. Security Commission, in which they inform us that you are only willing to pay \$80.00 on the claim lodged against you by the Vancouver General Hospital on account of your son Jun. We would just point out to you that the Vancouver General Hospital could enforce the payment of this claim in full. However, we have taken this matter up with them and they are prepared to accept \$135.00 in full settlement of the two claims against your family, namely \$166.35 against your son Jun and \$60.65 against your husband Rikimatsu, or a total of \$227.00. We are of the opinion that this is a very generous gesture on the part of the Hospital, and a very good opportunity for you to have these claims paid off.

We have also taken up the matter of the claim by the Royal Columbian Hospital against your husband Rikimatsu, amounting to \$204.75. They are prepared to make a full settlement of this claim for \$102.00.

This means that the two Hospitals, between them, are reducing their claims about \$200.00 in order to get an immediate settlement.

We note that you are settling the claim of Isamu UJIMOTO of \$6.71 direct, therefore, we are taking no further action with regard to this claim.


We beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 12th instant, enclosing certificates covering 133 shares of the Maple Ridge Co-operative Produce Exchange.

You were the holder of 200 shares, but certificates #103 for ten shares, #241 for twenty-three shares, and #338 for thirty-four shares have been lost, and therefore you are unable to send these certificates to us.

Seventeen shares were cancelled by the Co-operative for an amount owing to them by you and we attach hereto Custodian cheque in the amount of \$233.79, which is the proceeds from the redemption of 183 shares at the rate of \$1.27755 per share.
