This girl was a high school student at the time she signed a declaration to the Custodian in regard to her property on May 11, 1942. At that time she reported that she owned no property of any kind in the protected area.

However, the R.C.M.P. reported that a camera and radio had been surrendered by Miss MURATA on March 9, 1942. These articles were handed to the Custodian on July 11, 1944. The radio was reported to be missing in the spring of 1945. It is believed to have been stolen during a break-in at the warehouse. The camera was reported missing at the same time but this appears to have been an error, since the camera is listed on inventories taken March 15, 1946 and January, 1947.
