PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

This file reveals that the above owned no real property in any protected area of B.C., and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS: Mrs. HORII, who made her declaration to the Custodian on May 11/42 and was evacuated on May 28/42, declared no property of any description. However on April 1/43 she wrote to the Sisters of Atonement, Vancouver requesting shipment of the following goods which she had left in their care:

6 carpets	1 dresser	
3 chairs	2 carton boxes	shelf

In her letter of Nov. 9/46 she advises that these were shipped to her but that one bookcase was missing. This would probably be the shelf she asked for.

In this letter she also advises that she left some chattels in the basement of 700 E. Hastings. We have a rooming house listed at 701 E. Hastings which is very likely the address she meant. She has been advised that as this property was sold some time ago and no chattels found there in her name, that it is now too late for the Custodian to do anything about the matter.

BANK
ACCOUNT:

On our list of depositors on the Japan and Canada Trust & Savings file appears the name of Sumiye HORRI. As we have no one registered by that name, the HORII files were investigated and it appeared that Mrs. Sumie HORII might be the one who had the money in the account. In reply to our letter asking if she had any funds in the Japan and Canada Trust Co. she replied on Nov. 9/46 stating that she had. She also advised that she had lost her account book. A requisition has been made today transferring the sum of \$10.25 from the Japan and Canada Trust to the account of Mrs. HORII. This is her only credit with the Custodian. This sum is being paid to the hospital at her request as part payment of account owing by her husband. No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

In reply to your letter of the 9th instant, we would advise that we have credited your account with the sum of \$10.25, being the balance of your account with the Japan and Canada Trust Company.

On reviewing the file of your husband we note there is a claim against him by the Vancouver General Hospital in the sum of \$23.25. It occurred to us that you might wish to apply your credit of \$10.25 against this outstanding account. Will you please let us know your wishes in this matter.

With regard to chattels which you state you left in the basement of an apartment at 700 E. Hastings, we presume you mean 701 E. Hastings. We would advise that this property has been sold and all the chattels in it. As you have taken four years to advise us of these chattels it is unlikely that they can be found or identified at this late date. However if you will give us a detailed description of what was left there we will try and find them.
