LIABILITY SUMMARY

Re: ISHIDA, Michio - Reg. No. 11249.

The Retail Credit Grantors Bureau filed a claim against the above, on behalf of St. Paul's Hospital in the amount of \$21.00, on May 20, 1943. We wrote to ISHIDA regarding this claim but he disputed it on the basis that it was a Compensation Claim and should be paid by the Compensation Board (11/3/44). Information obtained by phone from the Compensation Board was to the effect that ISHIDA was entitled to 2 days hospitalization but remained 9 days. The difference, 7 days at \$3.00, \$21.00 was therefore owed by him. ISHIDA was advised of this but did not reply to our letter. We are writing to the Retail Credit Grantors Bureau, today and advising them that in the absence of any reply from ISHIDA we are unable to help them.

This file reveals no other liabilities.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: ISHIDA, Michio - Reg. No. 11249.

The above signed a declaration to the Custodian on May 11, 1942 and was evacuated on January 15, 1943. He was employed as a waiter at Hastings Park Clearing Station.

CHATELS: He did not declare any chattels in his first declaration, but, later on, sometime after September 28, 1942 he declared the following at 3014 Wall Street:

1 Box of Chinaware and Glassware

1 Box of books

1 Musical instrument

1 Electric Massage Machine

1 Box of Hats

3 Rolls of Wrapping paper

Several miscellaneous goods (all in woodshed).

The property at 3014 Wall Street was owned by Tsunehei YAMASHITA, File 12677. We advised ISHIDA on April 16, 1945 that the chattels in question had been removed in the name of YAMASHITA and that he would have to communicate with YAMASHITA in order to settle between themselves what proportion of the auction each was entitled to. No reply was received. On June 1, 1947 we sent the auction sheets to YAMASHITA and asked him to indicate which items belonged to ISHIDA. The letter was returned as "not at address". Nothing else can therefore be done and we are advising ISHIDA of this today.

MONEYS
OWING:

A refund of 1% Wage deduction for the first six months of 1941, \$5.59 was credited to this account. It is being remitted to the Japanese today.

This file reveals no other property.

We are in receipt of your letter of the 14th inst. relative to the above claim in which you refer us to the Workmen's Compensation Board.

We have contacted the Board and have received their verbal report of the accident suffered by you in February 1940. The Board says that the Hospital allowance made by it in such cases as yours is for two days, as your case was not a serious one. They paid the Hospital \$11.00, made up as follows:

2 days at \$3.00 per day	\$ 6.00
Use of operating room	<u>5.00</u>
Total -	<u>\$11.00</u>

They state that any additional time that you remained at the Hospital would be at your own expense. Apparently you did remain 9 days at \$3.00 per day after the Board ceased paying, and it is for these extra days that you are charged by the Hospital. We obtained a statement from the Hospital, showing \$21.00 as owing by you, and are enclosing the same to you herewith for your information.

Please let us have your further reply, and if you now agree that this is correct let us have the amount of \$15.41, as stated in our letter of the 20th January last, to enable us to settle this claim in your behalf.
