1 - 12 storey 8-room house 28x46' in very good condition. 1 well house 10x20, 1 woodshed 20'x34', 4 colony houses 12'x14', 1 garage and pickers house 24'x28', 1 chicken house 18'x120', 1 pump house 12'x14', 1 bath house 14'x22', 1 barn 20'x32'. Sueso URANO leased this property to William Smith, dates-18th April and 5th September, 1942. Term - Duration and 6 months after. Consideration: yearly rental of one-third share or portion of whole crop of different fruit and vegetables grown for sale. Lessor to pay taxes. This lease was handed to The Director, The Veterans' Land Act 2nd August, 1943.

Suezo URANO also gave a Bill of Sale to William Smith dated May 5th, which reads as follows:

Witnesseth

The party of the first part sells to the party of the second part (four hundred) (400) laying hens @ 80¢ each equal to the amount of three hundred and twenty dollars (\$320.00). The party of the second part agrees to pay taxes for the party of the first part on property (Blk. "A", South half Section sixteen (16) Block five (5) North range one (1) West Map five thousand and twenty one (5021) Surrey, for one year 1942. It is further agreed that the party of the second part will pay Sun Life Insurance for Policy Nos. 22,09714, 2,054,947, 2,040,803 and Canadian Mutual Benefit Asan. for Policy Nos. B-2937, B2474. The total of taxes and insurance premiums is approximately two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) The payment of the above premiums to be made in the fall of nineteen forty two (1942). The

Funds released to the credit of Suezo URANO as at May 19th, 1944, against which were the following charges: Registration Fees-\$3.00, Legal Fees-\$15.00 - \$18.00, leaving a net credit of \$1564.00 from said transaction.

Adjustments as at 1st January, 1943 to the amount of \$19.44, covering unexpired Fire Insurance Premiums, were placed to Suezo URANO'S credi

In view of the 1943 rents having been collected by the Custodian, viz., \$219.59, a cheque for same was issued to The Director, The Veterans' Land Act.

(\$206.87) Since we left Tashme for here we have had to live all on our own and things dont balance as we want it to. I have been working here and there but most of the work around here are logging and you can tell that I am not making anything to speak of. In your next letter can you send me the receipt for the taxes that you paid on the land for me, I dont know if it will do me any good but they say that a person dont have to pay any poll tax if you are paying taxes on land etc. Then there are afew things that I would like you to send me again when you get a little time. They are:-Saw-gauge, saw swedging steel, spider and saw hammer also if you can fimd the axe. The axe I think was in the basement, it was rather a new one. Daughter would also like to have her ring case if you can findit. It's a Henry Birks case made of silver and shaped like a dome. It is in the room right above the kitchen where we used to worship. There are a few Japanese here that are trying to start raising chickens for eggs. Right now they are not doing 50% and in some places they are just eating themselves right in the hole. During the time when eggs were pretty good they were hardly laying at all. You are doing a miracle with 65% laying compared to these around here. Werare having rather a mild weather for this part of the country, it gets to about 20 above in the mornings and evenings and quite warm in the day. Well, there are very little new s to tell around here so I am closing with the hope that this letter will find you in the best of health. Yours very sincerely. S. Urano P.S. I saw swedging steel I asked for is the one with the lever on it I guess it should be called saw setting iron as that is what it is used for.


