This file reveals that Mrs. MATSUNO owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS:

Mrs. MATSUNO made her declaration to the Custodian on May 12/42 and was evacuated on Oct. 28/42. She declared chattels as shown on Chattel Schedule on file, at the Continental Daily News, 213-215 E. Cordova St. Quite a number of these articles were not found by the Custodian. However shipments were made from this address to various Japanese by Mr. IWASAKI and by Mr. A.H. Young, who had the keys to the building. No record was kept of these shipments so it is impossible to know what goods the Japanese declared and which were not found by the Custodian, are actually missing. Chattels found at this address in the name of Mrs. MATSUNO were sold at auction for the net sum of \$42.30 and this sum credited to her account with the Custodian.

Mr. MATSUNO declared no property of any kind whatsoever.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.
