PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 8840

August 4, 1947

Re: Chiyoko TOGAWA, Reg.No.01181

This woman was a housewife. Her husband, Jiro (File 14818) stated that he owned no property in his declaration to the Custodian. At the time of her declaration to the Custodian, Mrs. TOGAWA was living with Mrs. Makino (File 8879) at 420 East Cordova. Mrs. Makino and her husband both declared that they owned no property in the protected area. Mrs. TOGAWA signed her declaration on May 12, 1942. She was evacuated on July 1, 1942.

Mrs. TOGAWA reported no real property and none is revealed in her file. She reported no insurance on her property.

Mrs. TOGAWA reported that her chattels would be left with the possessions of Mrs. Makino in one room at 420 E.Cordova, and that the key would be turned over to the rector of the Anglican Church, 430 E.Cordova Street.

Of the chattels reported by Mrs. TOGAWA the following were not found when Custodian agent visited these premises, some time prior to August 4, 1942;

2 Cupboards                      1 CCM Bicycle                      10 Vols. Educational Books.

This information was given to Mrs. TOGAWA. The translation of Mrs. TOGAWA's reply did not enlighten us as to the disposition of these. It would appear that she disposed of these articles to her satisfaction.

The other articles reported by Mrs. TOGAWA (sofa, bureau, 2 beds without mattresses) were found, together with a gasoline stove, one 2-piece cupboard very old and dirty, one chair and one narrow desk, according to Custodian letter of August 4, 1942.

On or around December 4, 1944, the chattels found at 430 Cordova Street East, were removed to auction. At that time the following goods were discarded as of no value:

while the following, of insufficient value to warrant removal, were left with the Rev. Mr. Gale, of the Anglican Mission Church, 430 E.Cordova Street:

3 Beds                      1 Home Made Table

According to memorandum, dated December 14, 1944, the chattels removed from 430 East Cordova Street, were identified by the Rev. Mr. Gale in whose care the goods had been left. Chattels identified as the property of Mrs. TOGAWA were sold at auctions on December 7, 1944, December 14, 1944, and December 7, 1945. The net proceeds from these sales amounted to \$22.18, which has been credited to Mrs. TOGAWA.

Mrs. TOGAWA reported two Prudential Life policies on the lives of her two sons. These were not brought under the control of this office.

MEMO - To Mr. Spain

Re: TOGAWA, Chivoko (Mrs. Jiro)

A Miss Owston called on me yesterday and handed me a Japanese letter herewith, the gist of which she gave me orally.

"They left Vancouver the beginning of June, leaving two boxes at the Union Fish Market, Powell Street. They want one containing moving picture camera and films marked with Mrs. Togawa's name and also that of Mr. Makino to be sent to them."

Miss Owston said that Mrs. Togawa would be willing to pay the charges.

Neither Mr. nor Mrs. Makino declare anything so the boxes may be assumed to be Mrs. Togawa's. You will see that she has still not answered your letter of October 29th and next time you write it would probably be better to address your letter to Mr. Hartley, the Supervisor and ask for his good offices.

I think that one of your men should investigate and perhaps move these boxes and then please write to the lady or the Supervisor advising that cameras cannot yet be sent.
