Kikuyo MAKINO died at Slocan, B. C. on March 2, 1944. She is survived by her husband, Katsuji, file #5927, and two daughters, Masano (Mrs. Ichio Makino), file #8879, and Maruno (Mrs. Kishiso Kimura), file #13410.

The deceased declared no assets to the Custodian and none appear on the file.

Claims were filed against Katsuji MAKINO, for indebtedness incurred by his wife, as follows:

Dr. Harrison.....	\$125.00
Dr. J. W. Thompson.....	125.00
B. C. Security Commission.....	80.00
(funeral expenses for Mrs. Makino)	

The first two of these debts were paid for Mr. MAKINO by his son-in-law, Kishiso Kimura. The B. C. Security Commission was advised on April 21, 1944, that no funds were available in this office from which to pay their claim but that it was being submitted to Katsuji MAKINO, the husband of the deceased, for payment.

No claims, other than those mentioned above, appear on this file.

We acknowledge receipt of letter of the 14th January by Kishizo Kimura on your behalf regarding two claims submitted to you on the 30th of December last. In reply we wish to say that we advised these parties of the contents of that letter and received replies as follows:

From Workmen's Compensation Board:-

"We wish to advise that the account referred to is made up of two minimum assessments of \$5.00 each for the years 1941 and 1942, less a credit of \$2.20 from the 1940 assessment. The levy mentioned is as indicated the minimum charge which is made where there has been any employment of labour during the calendar year in question."

From Dr. Harrison:-

"Your letter of January 23rd received. Enclosed are two bills, one of my own and one of Doctor J.W. Thomson. These accounts include total charges for services rendered to this patient, that is, including the operation."

Dr. Harrison, in forwarding his reply, enclosed a claim of Dr. J.W. Thomson for \$125.00 against you, which is in addition to his. Therefore, you will have the claim of Dr. Thomson to consider also, and advise us regarding its correctness or otherwise.
