Dear Sir:

Constable D. O. MacKay of the B. C. Police has stated that Mr. George McAllister, manager for the B. C. Packers at Wadhams Cannery, Rivers Inlet, B. C. has complained that a house on the cannery property belonging to a Japanese boat builder named R. Naganobu was broken into about the 30th of July, 1942 and about \$150 worth of boat building tools stolen. There are apparently no suspects in the case.

We are endeavoring to obtain a description of these tools from Naganobu in order that the police may endeavor to recover them but this seems unlikely.

It is not known here whether this Japanese placed his premises under the protection of the Custodian or otherwise.
