Re: K. UCHIMARU, S. UCHIMARU  
and Mrs. Y. GORYO

We are much obliged for your letter dated November 26th regarding the above Japanese claiming wages to the extent of \$176.40 from you.

We have recently communicated with the subject Japanese to obtain an itemized statement and to point out the reduction of 15 crates at .31¢ each. We must advise that the Japanese are quite willing to make this reduction and this will leave a total of \$171.75 owing to them. With reference to the itemized statement you have requested, they are unable to supply other than a total amount of hours for each month and which has been clearly outlined in our letter to you dated October 15th.

We also note that you are at this time unable to meet this liability but that consideration will be given after next year's fruit season. We would greatly appreciate your acknowledging this amount owing to the Japanese so that we may place same on file and also communicate with the Japanese concerned, stating to the effect that you are unable to make the necessary payment at this time but shall consider it at a later date.
