
Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on May 12, 1942. She was evacuated on October 15, 1942.

In her declaration she stated that she owned no property of any kind left in the protected area.

On September 27, 1943, the Custodian handed to the B. C. Security Commission a Singer sewing machine, which had been found in the former residence of this woman. This machine was shipped to her on September 27, 1943. The sewing machine was declared by her husband, Shosaburo KIMURA, Internee File 799.

A camera, surrendered by Shosaburo KIMURA, was, at his request, shipped to his wife on November 23, 1945.

This file reveals no interest in the real property dealt with in Internee File 799.

This file reveals no liabilities.

This file reveals no property of any kind other than that shown above. No funds belonging to this woman are in the Custodian Trust Account.

It will be necessary to send us the receipt and 50 cents to cover postage. Any portion of the 50 cents remaining after the postage is paid, will be returned to you.

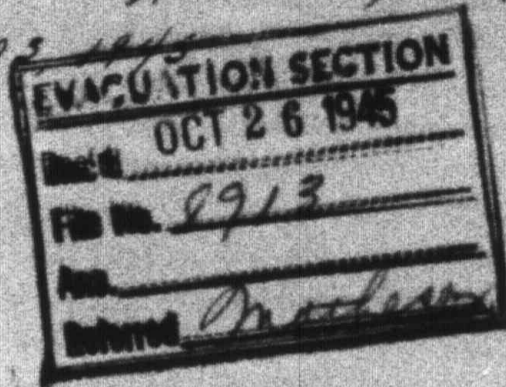

Re: P/W A-61 KIMURA, SHOZABURO

According to information given to this office, a camera, which is now in the Custodian's possession, was surrendered to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police by the above-mentioned Internee.

The wife of Shozaburo Kimura has asked us to send this camera to her. Before this can be done it is necessary that we have the receipt given to the owner of the camera by the police at the time the camera was surrendered. And, in a case such as this where the camera is requested by someone other than the reported owner, it is necessary that the owner instruct this office to ship the camera to the person who has requested shipment.

Would you kindly therefore ask this man if he wishes the camera sent to his wife? If he wishes this done, ask him to send the receipt to us, if it is in his possession. If it is not in his possession ask him where this receipt was left.

be released for the above purpose as our Japanese doctor
had been previously advised that any medicines required
by the daughter of the above-named woman could be obtained
at the Central Medical Stores in Slooan, free of charge."

For your information we are enclosing herewith
Mrs. Kimura's letter dated July 24, 1946, together with
a copy of Dr. U. Esmitakahara's letter dated July 23, 1946,
and also Mrs. Kimura's letter of August 18, 1946. These
enclosures, we believe, are self explanatory and, in view
of the contents of same, we would ask you to please advise
us, as soon as possible, as to whether or not you think
Mrs. Kimura is entitled to the sum of \$58.80 from her
husband's account with the Custodian.

We are informed that Mr. Shozaburo Kimura is
due for repatriation on the next boat. His credit
balance at the present time is \$108.58.
