This file reveals that Mrs. MATSUBAYASHI owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. She did carry \$1500.00 fire insurance on her household furniture with the Michigan Fire Insurance Co. but she advised that she had allowed this policy to lapse

CHATELS: Mrs. MATSUBAYASHI made her declaration to the Custodian on May 13/42 and was evacuated on June 2/42. She declared Chattels as shown on Chattel Schedule on file left at the Continental Daily News (Tairiku Nippo Sha), 213 E. Cordova St.

These are dealt with on the file of the husband. Certain articles as shown on the Schedule were not found by the Custodian. These may have been shipped to Mr. and Mrs. MATSUBAYASHI as we know shipments were made by Mr. IWASAKI and Mr. Young to various Japanese. However as no record was kept of these shipments it is impossible to know definitely. The balance of the chattels were sold at auction for the net sum of \$317.15 and this sum credited to the account of Mr. MATSUBAYASHI.
