This file reveals that the above owned no real property in any protected area of B.C., and did not carry any Fire insurance.

CHATELS: The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on May 13/42 and was evacuated on June 5/42, declared the following goods at a company house of the B.C.Pulp & Paper Co. at Woodfibre.

household effects
kitchen utensils
sundries

There is no trace that these chattels ever passed through our hands and it may therefore be assumed that he, like other Japanese at that time, had his things shipped to Vancouver and took delivery from the Union S.S. Co. dock and made his own disposition.

The file reveals the above owned no specified articles.

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE: We receive the sum of \$6.91 in favour of the above being a refund of income tax and this sum was remitted to him on Jan. 6/43.

WAR SAVINGS CERTIFICATES: The above declared 16 \$10.00 War Savings Certificates in his own possession. These were not brought under the control of the Custodian.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

MEMORANDUM

Re: Einar M. Hoff

In reply to your memorandum of the 16th instant, Mr. Hill reported that when the Japanese at Woodliffe were evacuated, he was at Woodliffe representing the U. S. Security Commission. When the evacuees reached Vancouver, many of them claimed their passports and removed them from the dock to some unknown destination, to sell, or ship them to up country camps.

A careful search has been made and whilst we have a complete list of Woodliffe passports, the name M. Hoff does not appear, nor was he able to associate his name with any of the arrivals received from Woodliffe. It must therefore be assumed that he made his own arrangements regarding disposal of his passport.
