GENERAL SUMMARY

Tsuyuo NAGAI, Deceased

Tsuyuo NAGAI died at Slocan, B. C. on January 18, 1943. According to information supplied by the R. C. M. P., she was a widow and is survived by two sons, Susumu, file #545, and Isao, file #7681; and four daughters, Kiyoko, file #8972, and Fumiko, Mariko & Sueko, minors.

The only assets declared by the deceased were a few chattels which were later found to be of no value and abandoned upon the authorization of the owner; War Savings S stamps in the names of her two daughters, Mariko and Sueko; and \$100.00 twenty-year endowment policies in the Prudential Insurance Company in the names of Fumiko, Mariko and Sueko. It was, however, reported on February 23, 1943, that Mrs. C. M. Baldwin, 4545 West 9th Avenue, was storing a radio belonging to the deceased. The radio was appraised by Mr. Thompeon as having only a value of \$25.00 although the ceiling price was \$29.00. The radio was offered for sale to Mrs. Baldwin for the sum of \$30.00, being the appraised value plus \$5.00 to cover the appraisal fee. Mrs. Baldwin declined this offer and the radio was removed to auction where it was sold for a net amount of \$9.89. In view of the small amount obtained from the sale, Mr. Thompeon withdrew his appraisal fee but this was later paid by this office upon the instructions of Mr. Wright & Mr. Shears as, by the time it was decided to pay the fee, the proceeds from the sale had been disbursed.

The B. C. Security Commission filed a claim for \$50.00 against the estate of the deceased to cover funeral expenses of the deceased. The small balance to the credit of the Estate in this office, \$9.89, was remitted to them to apply on this claim.

No assets and no liabilities, other than those mentioned above, appear on this file.

MEMORANDUM

This is a small estate with a radio the only asset. The radio was not very accurately appraised by Mr. Thompson and as the party holding it refused to pay the appraised price, we were left with no option but to remove the radio to auction. Unfortunately, the radio was sold at an auction conducted by an auctioneer other than Mr. Thompson, who had appraised it. Under the circumstances, however, Mr. Thompson withdrew his appraisal fee and the final effect of these transactions is that the radio was sold at auction for a net sum of \$9.98.

I suppose that this sum may be made available to the B. C. Security Commission against their usual claim of \$50.00 for funeral expenses.

You declared in your registration form of May 13 some personal property located at the above address. Our agent has now visited this address, and while he cannot find everything you declared, he has located the following:

- 1 carton of dirty clothes
- 1 sofa - dirty - very bad condition
- 2 pictures - no value
- 2 very dirty mattresses
- 1 heater stove - full of holes
- 1 homemade table - no value
- 2 broken beds
- 1 baby bed - very dirty - in very bad condition

As you left this equipment behind without making any arrangements for its storage, it occurs to us that you may have no further use for it. Our agent reports that the owner of the house is anxious to have it removed as he wishes to rent to other tenants. We do not think it is worthwhile incurring the expense of moving it to storage, and would suggest that you permit us to dispose of it as we see fit.
