



Dear Madam: Re: Seichi OHASHI, Deceased.

Upon reviewing the file of your husband, Seichi OHASHI, who we are advised died at Windsor, Ontario, on June 21, 1946, we find that we still have, in safe-keeping, two cameras which belonged to him. One is an Eastman Kodak, Serial #557984, and the other a "Super" camera. We also have to his credit in this office the sum of \$26.88, this credit being derived from the sale of a Leader, 12 Calibre Shotgun, made in Belgium, which was turned over to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police by your husband, and a \$5.00 Transportation Claim paid by the Canadian Government into the account of Seichi OHASHI in this office.

In order that our records with regard to your late husband's estate may be complete, we would ask you to fill in the information required on the enclosed Memorandum of Particulars Form and return it to this office and, at the same time, advise us if any arrangements have been made for the administration of your husband's estate.

In his declaration to the Custodian, Seichi OHASHI stated that he had a Manufacturers Life Insurance policy #73,576 for \$2000.00. From information obtained from the Vancouver office of the insurance company, we learned that this policy had been transferred to the Company's Windsor, Ontario, office. If no claim has been made for the death benefit under the policy, we would suggest that the named beneficiary file a claim with the Manufacturers Life Insurance Company, Windsor, Ontario, without delay.
