This man was evacuated on May 23, 1942. On May 13, 1942, he signed a declaration to the Custedian in which he stated that he owned no property of any kind in the protected area. On February 7, 1943, he wrote reporting ownership of some chattels and two accounts receivable. A JP form was sent to him and this he signed on July 26, 1943.

In the declaration of July 26, 1943, Tomijiro TANAKA reported owner-ship of one overcost, two suits, two comforters, one net float (value \$250.00) and kitchenware (value about \$50.00) all at North Pacific Cannery, Skeena River, B. G. It was not until March, 1944, that this file was referred to Mr. H. F. Green, of Custodian Protection Department. Mr. Green then communicated with the Anglo-British Columbia Packing Company, who operate North Pacific Cannery. No trace was found of the clothing and kitchenware however.

The net float was purchased by Angle-British Columbia Packers Ltd. on September 12, 1944, for the mam of \$250.00, which was credited to the account of Tomijiro TANAKA, who had approved the sale price. On April 27, 1945, we remitted to TANAKA the sum of \$100.00 from these funds. On May 7, 1945, TAMAKA wrote in regard to the proceeds of this sale, "You know that money is the money derived from the sales of the raft which the worker owned. Therefore speaking truthfully that money doesn't belong to me." We asked him on May 15, 1945, to supply us with the names of the owners of the raft, but have received no reply. The sum of \$250.00 is being held in his account until this matter is cleared up.

On May 25, 1944, we received a letter from this man acknowledging receipt of the sum of \$160.00 being proceeds from sale of 8 net tanks. This letter stated that he had left 10 tanks at North Pacific Cannery and he wanted to know to whom the two unsold tanks belonged as he would have to send the money received to the respective owners. The cheque for \$160.00 had not been sent from this office and we had no knowledge of the tanks. It appears likely that the cheque had come from North Pacific Cannery.

In regard to the accounts receivable, the sum of \$35.95 was transferred to the account of Tomijiro TANAKA from the account of Yasumatsu UYEYAMA, File 2184, in pro rate settlement of indebtedness of \$330.00. The other debtor, Tokuichi MIZUYABU, File 8012, stated that the claim was against Yeiichi MIZUYABU, File 1120 Neither Tokuichi MIZUYABU nor Yeiichi MIZUYABU have funds in Custodian account at this time, although at one time Yeiichi MIZUYABU did have an account of \$65.25. No further action will be taken by this office in regard to this claim.

TANAKA reported a Sun Life Assurance policy. On September 24, 1946, we received from the insurance company cheque for \$424.96, being cash surrender value. Cheque is being deposited to credit of his account.

Your letter of April 8th has been forwarded to us here by our Vancouver Office. Your previous letter in connection with this float of Tanaka's was addressed to the Vancouver Office and we have not a copy here. I understood from Mr Harry Lord, who handled this matter below, that you has asked us to set a price on the float and when the matter was referred to me I set the price of \$200.00 on the float.

Reading over your letter of April 8th thereappears to be some confusion about this float as Tanaka's float is just a bare not float used for racking nets on. It has no house of any kind on it and we have already settled with Tanaka for the bluestone tanks which were on thw float. These tanks we have removed.

The only float here at North Pacific which approaches your description would be that which belonged to S.Sasaki. Whatever material was in or on this floathouse has long since disappeared. The windows were all boarded up but even the sash have been removed.

Until I hear from you clearing away the present uncertainty as to which float is under discussion I will not make any direct offer to Tanaka. Let me have his present address when you write.
