On Sept. 3/42 Morris & MacLennan wrote to our agent, H.D. Campbell, and advised him that the claim of the Farmer's Products Distributing Co. Ltd. had been settled in full. A copy of this letter is on our file.

B. C. Purchasers' Co-operative Assn. \$11.38

We were advised by Morris & MacLennan in their letter of May 14/42 that this account had been paid in full.

Provincial Board of Health, T.B. Unit \$1281.00

This claim is for hospitalization of Miss Ayako HAMADE, daughter of Yoshigoro HAMADE, at St. Joseph's Hospital from Aug. 26/37 to Jan. 6/39. Mr. Campbell, our agent, reported that Mr. HAMADE had been paying the Board of Health the sum of \$15.00 per month for Miss HAMADE and that he considered the account paid. This information was conveyed to Mr. McKee, Collector of Institutional Revenue. Mr. McKee sent us a statement of the account together with a copy of the agreement for maintenance signed by Mr. HAMADE. He also stated that in Nov. 1938, Mr. HAMADE had stopped paying the \$15.00 per month, telling them that his financial position no longer enabled him to make these payments. It was finally agreed that this claim should be settled for \$34.00 and in his letter of Aug. 24/45 HAMADE asks us to pay this sum to the Collector of Institutional Revenue from funds standing to his credit with this office. This payment was made on Aug. 31/43. This payment was accepted on the understanding that should the financial position of HAMADE change materially, that they could then re-open the matter of a further payment.

There are no claims on the file of his wife, File 10229.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

RE: Yoshigoro HAMADE, Reg. No. 05880

This file reveals that HAMADE owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. and did carry fire insurance of \$1500.00 on his store and fixtures and \$500.00 on personal goods. As the business was sold in August 1942, this insurance was not renewed on its expiry date of Dec. 13/42.

CHATELS:

HAMADE made his declaration to the Custodian on May 14/42 and was evacuated on Sept. 23/42. He declared chattels as shown on Chattel Schedule on file.

The bulk of his stock he sold privately and the balance of the stock and fixtures were sold by Bill of Sale for the sum of \$185.00. A down payment of \$30.00 was paid direct to HAMADE by the purchaser. The balance of \$155.00 was paid by the purchaser direct to our agent. From this was deducted one half cost of legal fees for drawing up the Bill of Sale in the sum of \$3.75, and the net proceeds of \$151.25 were remitted to this office by our agent, Mr. H.D. Campbell, and credited to the account of HAMADE.

His household effects were stored at the B.C. Purchaser's Co-operative, 573 E. Hastings St. Norris and MacLennan gave us a list of the goods stored at this address in the name of HAMADE. Two beds and a baby bed were not found. It would appear that the listing of four kitchen stoves must have been an error and inasmuch as we have sold one heater and one two burner gas plate in the name of HAMADE, I believe the stoves are accounted for.

A shipment of 5 parcels of effects was sent to HAMADE through the B.C.S. Shipping charges on this amounted to \$4.46 and this amount was paid to the B.C.S.C. on June 24/44 and charged to the account of HAMADE.

The balance of the goods found in the name of HAMADE at 573 E. Hastings St., with the exception of one bed which was discarded, were sold at auction for the net sum of \$44.08 and this sum credited to his account with the Custodian.

Two wooden cabinets, 7 blinds and 2 stove boards, not listed on list given to us by Norris and MacLennan, were sold and credited to HAMADE. He has been given copies of our auction sheets and has not denied ownership of these goods, so I have left them credited to his account.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES:

On March 9/42 HAMADE surrendered a General Electric mantel radio to the R.C.M.P. This was handed over by them to the Custodian on Feb. 17/44 and sold at auction for the net sum of \$20.81 and this sum credited to his account with the Custodian.

WAR SAVINGS CERTIFICATES & VICTORY BONDS:

He declared one \$50.00 Victory Bond and \$200.00 in War Savings Certificates. These were not brought under the control of the Custodian.

SHARES:

An excerpt on file dated Jan. 12/44 states that HAMADE owned 10 shares in the B.C. Purchasers' Co-operative Association. He is also listed as having 22 shares in the Canada Mico Co. Ltd.

BANK ACCOUNT:

He declared a current account in the Bank of Montreal, Main and Hastings but did not give the amount. This account was not brought under the control of the Custodian.



LIFE  
INSURANCE:

He declared a Sun Life Assurance policy in the sum of \$5000.00, the beneficiary being his wife. On Feb. 21/44 he asked us to make a partial payment on premium owing on this policy. His entire credit balance at that time was \$117.25 and this sum was paid to the insurance company on his behalf to apply on the premium due on his policy.

Our agent, H.D. Campbell, looked after this business. He gave us detailed reports on the business of green grocer and confectioner carried on by HAMADE under the name of "Cape Sun Market". HAMADE sold most of his stock privately. The business, together with the small amount of stock remaining, and the fixtures, were sold by Bill of Sale for the sum of \$185.00. A down payment of \$30.00 was made by the purchaser direct to HAMADE. The balance was paid in to our agent Mr. Campbell. Legal fees for drawing up the Bill of Sale were paid for equally by the purchaser and Mr. HAMADE. One half of these fees in the sum of \$3.75 was deducted from the balance of \$155.00 paid by the purchaser and the net proceeds in the sum of \$151.25 was remitted to this office and credited to the account of HAMADE.

Household furniture - H.D. Campbell advised that HAMADE was storing his household goods with a Japanese organization. The following is a list given to us by Norris & MacLennan of goods stored by HAMADE at the B.C.Purchasers' Co-operative Assn., 573 E. Hastings St.

I have today inspected the property of the above Japanese and wish to report as follows:-

1. The business carried on by Hamade at 1102 Commercial Drive is that of Green Grocer and Confectionery, under the name "Cape Sun Market".  
*Sept 3/42*
2. The rental Agents for the property, which does not belong to the declarant, are Loewen & Harvey Ltd., 751 Dunsmuir Street. The rent of the property is \$55.00 per month on a month-to-month basis and is in a current position.  
*MA 4341 Phoned they stated rent paid*
3. This declarant is endeavouring to sell his business, but so far has not been successful. In view of his intention to sell the property, I have not seen fit to make any inventory of stock, fixtures or household furniture.
4. Hamade is under instructions to report again to the Commission on June 1, but as he is under the Doctor's care and medically unfit will presumably receive a further extension.
5. Hamade advises me that his stock is being gradually reduced and is already considerably less than at the time of making his "JP" Declaration.
6. He further advises me that certain household effects, etc., have been stored with a Japanese Organization, who have made available storage space for Japanese evacuees. In this connection he has promised to provide me with a list of the property he has so stored for record purposes.
7. He confirms the fact that he has no personal or trade debts, with the exception of current week-to-week accounts which he is settling on demand.
8. I have urged Hamade to carry on with his intention to sell the business as a going concern, and to advise me immediately if he obtains a firm offer in order that I may request your approval for the sale and supervise its execution.
9. I will advise you further as matters develop.



SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT

YOUR FILE NO. 9042.

1. I have today again contacted the above Japanese declarant who is still operating the store.
2. On enquiring as to what results he had obtained through his efforts to sell the business, he advised me that he had an offer of \$750.00 at the end of June, on which he accepted a \$20.00 deposit, but that the Chinese purchaser was not prepared to go through with the deal and that the deposit was refunded.
3. He advises me that his stock has now been reduced to the extent that it is under \$500.00.
4. As I understand from him that he will be leaving the protected area in about ten days, I have urged him to make a special effort to try to arrange for some sale of the business and with a view to helping him in this connection, I have sent down several prospects who may be interested in purchasing his Market.
5. In event of him being unable to effect a sale, he will turn over the keys of the store to me before he is evacuated, at the same time providing me with an inventory of his fixtures and furniture, and also a list of the furniture already stored with the B. C. Purchasers Association on Hastings Street.
6. I will report to you further on the Japanese' evacuation unless I receive a prior request from him for your approval of the sale of his business.

SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT

YOUR FILE NO. 9042.

1. The above evacuee came into my office on the 29th of August accompanied by two Chinese who, he advised me, had made an offer to purchase the few remaining stock and fixtures of his market.
2. He further advised me that he had accepted a deposit of \$30.00 on account of the agreed purchase price of \$185.
3. As my investigator had recently checked on the situation with regard to developments of evacuation plans and found that the stock had been almost entirely disposed of and the sale arrangements had already been entered into by the Japanese himself, confirming the fact to me that he was satisfied with the deal, I could see no objection that the Office of the Custodian would have to his arrangements.
4. I accordingly arranged with Mr. J. A. MacLennan of Norris and MacLennan to draw up a Bill of Sale Absolute in favor of the Chinese, Daniel Lee, and arranged for its execution on the 31st of August.
5. As your office had advised me on the 13th of July that there was a claim against Hamade for \$97.65 by the Farmers' Products Distributing Co. Ltd. I checked with Mr. MacLennan in this connection, as he is the solicitor for that Company. He advised me that this debt had been settled in full and has subsequently confirmed this in writing.
6. On completion of the Deed of Sale by Hamade, Daniel Lee turned over to Mr. MacLennan the sum of \$155.00 in cash, being the balance of the purchase price. As the legal fees involved amounted to \$7.50, which it was mutually agreed should be split between the purchaser and seller, Mr. MacLennan has remitted to me his cheque for \$151.25, representing the \$155.00 less \$3.75, being Hamade's share of the legal fees. I am enclosing herewith receipted account from Norris and MacLennan for the legal fees. The cheque for \$151.25 has been endorsed by myself payable to G. W. MacPherson, Deputy Custodian, and is enclosed herewith.
7. Transfer of the City Licence was signed by Hamade and turned over to Daniel Lee on receipt of \$15.00 by Hamadi representing the value of the unexpired portion of the Licence.
8. Hamade completed an Affidavit under the Bulk Sales Act which is negative, a copy of this is enclosed herewith.
9. On contacting Mr. Peers in connection with the immediate disbursement of a portion of this money to Hamade I was advised that there was a claim for an unspecified amount by the Provincial Government and until the matter was investigated and the claim either settled or waived no distribution could be made. On investigating the situation I obtained the following more or less vague details: Apparently Hamade's daughter was a patient in the St. Joseph's Oriental Hospital for a period just short of two years, dating from some time in 1937. While the usual hospital



charge was \$25.00 per month lesser amounts were accepted by the Hospital, depending on the patient's ability to pay.

At the time of Hamade's daughter entering the Hospital the situation was apparently reviewed with regard to assessing the amount he was capable of paying and a basis of \$15.00 a month was accepted by the Hospital. Hamade advises me that this amount was paid regularly every month during his daughter's hospitalization. He understood that this settled his account in full and further states that he has never since received any account or notification that he owed any further money in this connection. Apparently since a claim of this nature is now being made by the Provincial Government the difference between what is accepted from a patient and the standard charge is underwritten by the Provincial Government.

However, as there has been a period of three or four years elapse since her discharge from the Hospital the present claim is not altogether understandable. As a result of this matter dating back so far Hamade is not very exact on the details so I am arranging for my interpreter, Joe Mizuhara, to interview the daughter at Hastings Park with a view to getting more exact information which I will pass along to you in order that you may write the Provincial Government in connection with this claim and come to some understanding or arrangement with them.



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P. S. Since dictating the above report I have been advised by Miss Hamade's sister that the approximate date of her hospitalization was from August, 1937, to June, 1939, and that the \$15.00 monthly payments were made to the Social Service Department, 520 Cambie Street, Vancouver, B. C.

SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT

YOUR FILE NO. 9042.

1. The above evacuee came into my office on the 29th of August accompanied by two Chinese who, he advised me, had made an offer to purchase the few remaining stocks and fixtures of his market.

2. He further advised me that he had accepted a deposit of \$30.00 on account of the agreed purchase price of \$185.

3. As my investigator had recently checked on the situation with regard to developments of evacuation plans and found that the stock had been almost entirely disposed of and the sale arrangements had already been entered into by the Japanese himself, confirming the fact to me that he was satisfied with the deal, I could see no objection that the Office of the Custodian would have to his arrangements.

4. I accordingly arranged with Mr. J. A. MacLennan of Norris and MacLennan to draw up a Bill of Sale Absolute in favor of the Chinese, Daniel Lee, and arranged for its execution on the 31st of August.

5. As your office had advised me on the 13th of July that there was a claim against Hamade for \$97.65 by the Farmers' Products Distributing Co. Ltd. I checked with Mr. MacLennan in this connection, as he is the solicitor for that Company. He advised me that this debt had been settled in full and has subsequently confirmed this in writing.

6. On completion of the Deed of Sale by Hamade, Daniel Lee turned over to Mr. MacLennan the sum of \$155.00 in cash, being the balance of the purchase price. As the legal fees involved amounted to \$7.50, which it was mutually agreed should be split between the purchaser and seller, Mr. MacLennan has remitted to me his cheque for \$151.25, representing the \$155.00 less \$3.75, being Hamade's share of the legal fees. 
