SHARE ALL SUMMERS File No. 9026 November 10, 1947. IWATA, Yama (Mrs. Tekamitsu) Reg. No. 07964 tre. Teath was a dressmaker. She ran the business known as the Victoria Dye Works, 632 Victoria Drive, Vancaiver, B.C. This building consisted of a store at the front and two rooms used as living quarters at the back. It was rented from Horne, Taylor & Co. Ltd., 817 W. Pender Street, agents for Mr. Paine. This file reveals no liabilities of any kind. Mrs. IMATA made her declaration to the Custodian on May 14, 1942, and she was evacuated on May 22, 1942. The possessions she listed were as follows: 3 beds I dining room set 1 bookease L feeble 1 heater l sofa 1 Singer Sewing Machine 1 Taylor Sewing Machine She stated at that time that she would try to sell her goods prior to departure. On May 22, 1942 Mrs. IMATA said that her furniture had been moved from 632 Victoria Drive to 610 Victoria Drive (empty house) owned by Mr. Paine, Vancouver. She did not say how many articles, if any, she had disposed of. On October 21, 1942, we wrote Mrs. Patterson, 610 Victoria Drive, advising that our investigators had learned that Mrs. INATA had left her chattels in her care. We asked Mrs. Patterson to send us a list of the chattels, and also asked if she was prepared to care for these chattels and accept responsibility for same. On October 22, 1942, Mr. Paine, 571 Richards Street, called and advised that the furniture of Mrs. IWATA had been sold, with the exception of 1 cheet of drawers, 1 bed and spring, left in his care and 1 kitchen cebinet which she wanted him to sell for her. He said he would send us the money he obtained from the sale of the cabinet. There is no evidence that he ever sold it so it can be assumed it is still in his care. He does not say who arranged the sale of the other furniture or when it took place. Mrs. IMATA declared that she had three \$5.00 War Savings Certificates in her own possession. This file reveals no other properties of any kind. This Summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on hand.

Dear Radent On receipt of your letter of November 3, 1947, we examined your file, and we found that on May 14,1942, you reported that your possessions were 3 bads, one dining room set, one bookcase, one table, one heater, one soft, one Singer sewing machine and one Taylor sewing machine. You stated that you would try to sell these goods prior to your evacuation. On May 22, 1942, you reported that your furniture had been moved to 610 Victoria Drive, an empty house owned by Mr. Paine, and that the key to the house was in the possession of Er. Paine. Upon investigation it was found that the person in whose care your goods were late was Mr. Philip Penn, 571 Richards Street, Vancouver, Mr. tenn schooledged holding for you one kitchen cabinet, one cheet of drawers and one bed and spring. Our records do not indicate the disposition of the other erticles declared by you. According to our records, one carten of books, five cushions and some clothes were shipped to your husband in December, 1943. These goods appear to be the centents of the bureau or chest of drawers left in the care of Mr. Penn, and were requested by Mr. Iwats on October 4,1943. Apart from the shipment made to Mr. Inata, our records do not show any change in the arrangements you made with Mr. Penn for the storage of your Iours truly, P. Matheson, Office of the Custodian. P.S. It will be in order for you to make such arrangements as you may wish with Mr. Penn in regard to the disposition of the goods which you left in his core.
