| 42 judo mats | - Loaned to the Vancouver Athletic Association, 341 Gore Ave on Sept. 22/43. I have written to the representative of the Vancouver Athletic Association who signed for these judo mats and as soon as a reply has been received from him I will add the information to this Schedule. |
| 14 Judo uniforms | - no information on file of the Fairview Nippon Go-Gakko, 13127, regarding these uniforms. |
| 2 large canvases | - not found |
| 6 pictures complete | - I have checked the file of Seitaro NISHIKAWA who was President of the Mikado Young Men's Society. In his letter of May 15/44 he asks for shipment of certain boxes at 833 W. 7th Ave. He advises that these contain among other things, records and cash book of 2 Clubs, souvenirs, picture frames and school books. One crate of pictures was shipped to him on June 14/44. It is just possible these may have been the pictures belonging to this Society. |
| 1 bookshelf | - This may have been one of the bookcases on loan to the Fairview Youth Club which are missing. |
| 1 mimeograph machine | - Only one mimeograph machine was found at 154 W. 5th Ave. and as the Fairview Nippon Go-Gakko declared one, this one that we found has been considered as belonging to the that organization. I do not know whether it is possible that both organizations may have declared the one machine. |
| 4 silver trophy cups | - According to Mr. Wills these were moved from 154 W. 5th Ave. and should be in our warehouse, although they may be stored in the name of the Fairview Nippon Go-Gakko. This organization however, did not declare them, and the Mikado Young Men's Society did. As soon as Mr. Wills has returned to work, I will ask him if these are still in the warehouse. According to his list of goods still in the warehouse, the trophy cups are not on hand. |

Mr. John G. Whelan, of the Vancouver Police Department, has telephoned in reply to our letter of April 23, 1947. The information supplied is given in memorandum of this date on file.

Now that we have found the judo mats, or at least have knowledge that these are under the control of responsible persons, and know that they are in fairly good condition, what do we wish to do about the 42 mats belonging to the Mikado Young Men's Society?

Do we wish to have these returned to the Custodian?

Do we wish to sell these to the persons who have been using them?

The mats are made in Japan, according to Mr. Whelan, and can not be purchased in this country. Is it possible to get an appraisal made, if it is desired to sell?

MEMORANDUM to File 9056

May 17, 1947

Re: Mikado Young Men's Society Koendan

Mr. John G. Whelan, telephoned this morning in regard to our letter of April 23, 1947. Mr. Whelan said that he had spent some time in connection with the judo mats and had succeeded in find all of the 42 lent to the Vancouver Athletic Association.

Mr. Whelan stated that the mats were intact, and were in fairly good condition. The mats have been in use since they were lent to the association in September, 1943, and some or all show evidences of this wear.

Some of these mats are now at the Western Gym, 139 E. Cordova Street. Others are at boys clubs in various parts of the city.

Mr. William Calder, President of the Merchants Cargage Company Ltd., 716 Cambie Street, Telephone Marine 3271, has been associated with Mr. Whelan in connection with the boys clubs, and he has knowledge of where the mats, not at 139 E. Cordova, are to be found.

Mr. Whelan wants to know what we want done about the mats. He stated that Mr. Calder, or some of his associates in this work, might be interested in purchasing the mats. Mr. Whelan said he had no idea of the value of the mats. He suggested that we get in touch with Mr. Calder for any further information about the mats.

Mr. Whelan's home telephone is Marine 1493. His office phone is PA.6657. He would like to be informed when it is decided what is to be done. He offered any further assistance he could give, and expressed appreciation for the use of the mats.
