In reply to your letter of September 17th we would advise that we have no funds standing to your credit in this office. We regret that we are therefore unable to pay your insurance premium at the present time.

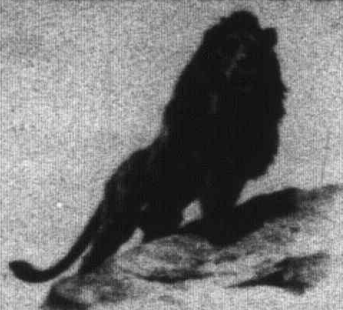
