Upon further investigation it was found that in April 1942 prior to his declaration of May 15th, 1942, this man, although an infant, assigned that Agreement to Miss Anne Robinson, and received his equity in cash from her. The matter was referred to Solicitors acting for the White purchaser and registrable conveyance delivered to the purchaser. The Real Property mentioned on this file is dealt with on Real Property Summary on file.

#### CHATTELS:

AKASE registered with the Custodian on May 15/42 and was interned on June 12/42. He signed a yellow "No property" card stating that he owned no property of any kind in the protected area. However on Feb. 17/44 he sent in a Custodian Release asking for shipment of a trunk containing personal effects left in care of T.H.Richard at 142 5.5th Ave. This was handed to the B.C.S.C. on May 25/44 for shipment to AKASE.

### SPECIFIED ARTICLES:

On Oct. 8/42 AKASE surrendered a radio and a Victor mantel radio to the R.C.M.P.

The camera was handed to the B.C.S.C. and shipped to AKASE on Aug. 10/43.

The radio was sold at auction for the net sum of \$1.75 and this sum credited to his account with the Custodian. This is his only credit on our books. In his letter of Aug. 5/43 he states that he was not given a receipt from the R.C.M.P. for his radio and camera and he repeats this again in his letter of March 9/47. As the credit from sale of his radio is so little, we are not going to write and ask for a signed declaration that he did not receive a receipt.

No property interests other than shose mentioned above are found on this file.

Dear Sir: On August 1st, 1941 Misao Akase of 141 West 2nd Avenue, Vancouver, B.C. purchased Lot 4. Block 30. District Lot 200A from the City of Vancouver under an agreement for Sale for \$1100.00 payable \$300.00 cash and \$20.00 per month. At that time he was only nineteen years of age, having been born on the 20th of November 1922. On the 9th day of April this year he sold his interest in the agreement for sale to Anne Robinson at 1557 11th Avenue West, for \$440.00 and she assumed the balance owing under the agreement of \$680.00. The money was paid over to Misao Akase and a short time afterwards Mr. H. Hargreaves who had drawn the assignment learned that Misao Akase was an infant. It was therefore necessary to apply to the Court under the "Infant's Act" of this Province to have the sale approved and a proper assignment executed by his guardians.

300 Custodian of Alien Property. August 13th, 1942. On the 16th day of April, I filed a Petition under the "Infant's Act", by his Mother Kameo Akase, and his Father, Hiroshi Akase and on Priday April 17th, an Order was made in the Supreme Court Chambers approving of the said transfer.
