On contacting the above situation on the 31st of August to see what developments had taken place I found that Mrs. Yamanaka, the declarant's sister, had shipped to Mrs. Nakagawa the main items of her equipment, namely one waving machine and two dryers. The shipping instructions were c/o the Imperial Fuel Company, 263 Bathurst Street, London, Ontario.

As she had a letter, which my interpreter read, from her sister instructing her to do this there would seem to be no objection to this action. The letter mentioned also instructed her to dispose of the balance of the fixtures which she has done. I therefore obtained from her a letter outlining the situation and am enclosing same to you for your records.

As this apparently is a satisfactory disposition of this case I am closing my file in connection therewith.

I wish to advise you that this declarant has left the protected area and is now located in care of Hepburn Farm, St. Thomas, Ontario.

However, the business is still being carried on by the declarant's sister, Mrs. Yamanaka and her Mother, Mrs. Kitano, who are under instructions to advise me of their evacuation arrangements as they develop.

With regard to the future disposition of the declared property, consisting mainly of beauty shop equipment, the Sister and Mother are hoping to go to Slokan and taking this equipment with them. They advise me that they have the declarant's permission to do this. If this can be arranged, it should be a very satisfactory solution to the disposal of this case.





YOUR FILE NO. 9207.

1. I contacted the above yesterday at her place of business at 322 Main Street, and found that she has received no instructions whatsoever with regard to evacuation and intends to carry on business indefinitely.
2. A general check of the equipment and fixtures agrees with the equipment listed in the declaration.
3. In view of Mrs. Nakagawa's intention of continuing operation of her business, there is nothing further I can do in this matter at the present time. I have given her the usual instructions to advise me of any evacuation plans she may make, that she is to turn in the key to the property at such time, advising me of her wishes with respect to the disposal of the equipment, and also warning her against making any sale of the equipment without reference to me.
4. I will make a supplementary report whenever there is a change in the situation.
