




Life Insurance: Sun Life Insurance Co., Policy No. 2227501 in the amount of \$1,000.00 - in owner's possession. No action by Custodian required.

CHATTEL SUMMARY

Re: Tetsuo TAMEMOTO

In his declaration of May 15, 1942, Tetsuo Tamemoto states that the personal property of Mrs. Tamemoto would be left at P. O. Box 201, No. 2 Road, Steveston. He states that he would leave the key with a Mrs. Branscomb of Steveston, who lives where the owner of the property occupied by Tamemoto lived.

The file reveals nothing further has been done with these chattels. We have checked with Mrs. Branscomb by telephone today and she gave the name of the owner of the property, occupied by Tamemoto, as D. Dowdich. She informs us that this man died approximately 3 years ago, and before his death sold this property to 3 young men, whose names she cannot recall. Mrs. Branscomb states that this was merely a shack and was situated close to the "yke on No. 2 road.

The file reveals that on July 22, 1942, Mr. Robinson, under the name of Tetsuo Tamemoto, removed chattels from the Great West Cannery House No. 10 to the Custodian's Warehouse No. 4, and on July 10, 1942, he removed, also under Tetsuo Tamemoto's name, chattels from the Canadian Pacific Cannery House No. 19 to Custodian's Warehouse No. 2. A list of these was sent to Tamemoto, which he signed for as representing all his chattels in the Protected Area.

Tetsuo Tamemoto may have moved his chattels from No. 2 Road to the Canadian Pacific House No. 19, as, in cartons and boxes, marked Tetsuo Tamemoto and opened up on October, 1945, different articles of chinaware and miscellaneous goods were found. Some were sent to auction and others were discarded as being of no value - see schedule.


As it is impossible to separate or identify the goods of Tetsuo Tamemoto and his father, Josuke Tamemoto, we are sending the entire proceeds to Tetsuo and asking him to make the necessary adjustments with his father.

With further reference to Tetsuo Tamemoto's declaration, he stated he left 9 web nets, 3 lead line nets and 1 cork line net to be taken care of by the Cannery caretaker at the Great West Cannery. He further states that if possible, the nets are to be left in the hands of Norris & McLennan, Solicitors.

The file reveals that 5 nets were sold by the Custodian and 4 nets sold through the cannery. The proceeds were credited to Tetsuo Tamemoto's account.

It is noted, in the file, on April 12, 1946, Nelson Brothers Fisheries reported that they purchased fishing equipment from Tetsuo Tamemoto in the amount of \$150.00.





We are enclosing herewith our cheque in the amount of \$149.61, made out in the joint names of Josuke Tamemoto and Tetsuo Tamemoto, being the entire balances of both your accounts with the Custodian.

It appears that Tetsuo Tamemoto removed his chattels from No. 2 Dyke Rd., Steveston, to the Great West Cannery, after making his declaration to the Custodian. When the chattels found at the Great West Cannery were inventoried by the Custodian's agent, they were done so under the name of Tetsuo Tamemoto. You also declared that you left goods at the Great West Cannery, but as these goods were not tagged with the proper names, they too were removed under the name of Tetsuo. A list of these goods was sent to your son and he returned this list, declaring that it represented all of his chattels in the restricted area, therefore it was impossible for this office to identify the ownership of these articles. 

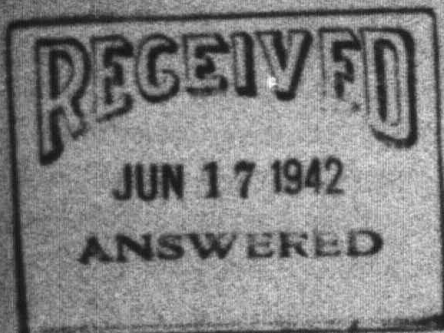
