We have your letter of October 10th and your reference to previous correspondence.

You have been advised in regard to the liquidation of the above company's assets and received a Statement which showed a surplus of \$19,317.32. Since that date you have been advanced the sum of \$10,000.- and \$5,000.- leaving a balance of \$4,317.32. There has been an additional Controller's charge of \$60.- and the balance now on hand is \$4,257.32.

The \$15,000.- referred to above has been forwarded to you as the principal shareholder. No amounts have been advanced to the other shareholders of your family.

It is regretted that time has elapsed in bringing these matters to a final conclusion. However, until the formal winding-up of the company has been completed, we are not in a position to make any further distribution to the shareholders.

In reference to the winding-up of the company, the Custodian has already issued instructions to the Liquidator to take the necessary proceedings and the matter is now in his hands to carry out all the necessary legal requirements. We are hoping that this may be accomplished before the end of the year. However, as stated above, you are aware of the financial situation and subject to proper clearance from Income Tax Authorities and other matters which have to be clarified, the balance of \$4,257.32 will in due course be accounted for.

I am in receipt of your letter of the 15th instant and have noted the previous correspondence to which you refer.

The liquidation of the assets of the above company have been completed for some time and fuller information in regard to same might have been previously given to you.

The distribution of capital to shareholders is a matter that involves certain legal procedure and advice has only just been received from Ottawa giving this office instructions to proceed to formal winding up of companies whose assets have already been liquidated and to make a final distribution to the shareholders.

A formal liquidation of the above company will therefore have to be made which calls for the appointment of a Liquidator and for certain routine of advertising for creditors and other technicalities.

In view of the fact that in the case of the above company you are the main shareholder with other members of the family, we are prepared to forward you a further remittance by way of an advance pending the procedure above referred to. In this connection we have received a further sum of \$5,000.- from the Controller, and a cheque for this amount is enclosed herein.

There is a balance of approximately \$4,000.- still in the hands of the Controller which, as indicated above, will be available for distribution to the shareholders when the company is formally wound up.

I have marked our file to be brought to my attention at the end of July, at which time as full a report as possible will be sent to you showing the current position.

- (1) "Services of Controller \$160.00" - This disbursement was made under Regulations governing appointment of Controller as set out in The Revised Regulations respecting Trading with the Enemy (1943). Notwithstanding your appointment of Mr. A. H. Young to look after your interests the confusion necessitated the appointment of a Controller to assist in the settlement.
- (2) "M. A. Englebeen, Adjustment \$137.00" - This represents the closing adjustments re property sale as at 19th March, 1945. We enclose separate statement showing in detail how this amount is made up.
- (3) "Mrs. T. Maikawa, House Expense \$100.59" - This item is made up of insurance, taxes, and water rates on house, paid out by Mr. A. H. Young from rents collected. This is fully explained in our letter of 26th February, 1945 to Mrs. Tetsu MAIKAWA, to which please refer.

Our Mr. Shears is at present absent from the City but in the meantime, in order to meet your present needs, we are enclosing herewith our cheque in your favour for \$10,000.00 receipt of which please acknowledge. This cheque is by way of an advance as suggested in our letter of 12th December last. You may expect to hear further from us soon after Mr. Shears' return during the early part of next month.

I note that you have made previous enquiries regarding the affairs of the above company of which you are the principal shareholder.

You were recently sent the sum of \$996.75 representing the balance of the company's liability to you, apart from your participation as a shareholder.

As you are aware, the affairs of your company were for some considerable time after evacuation looked after by Mr. A.H. Young, acting as your Solicitor. Subsequently the Custodian appointed a Controller with powers of liquidation. However, at the time of this appointment Mr. Young informed us that negotiations for the sale of your property at 298 Alexander Street was being carried on with the Vancouver Holdings Ltd. We offered no objection to these negotiations proceeding and eventually an offer of \$23,000.- was received and the transaction approved by the shareholders. The net amount, after payment of \$1,500.- commission to the Vancouver Holdings Ltd., being \$21,500.-

A statement showing cash receipts and disbursements is attached, from which it will be seen that apart from an account for the services of the Liquidator which has not yet been received, there is at present a cash surplus of \$19,317.32.

The final balance will be available for distribution to shareholders according to their respective interests. Before this distribution is made it will be necessary for the company to be formally liquidated, but if you so desire a portion of the funds could be made available to you by way of an advance until the liquidation of the company is formally completed.






