

The Government of Canada acknowledges that *NAGATOSHI IUTARO* has surrendered property situated in Canada as described herein and agrees to remit the yen equivalent of the net proceeds of such property immediately, or upon liquidation if such action is required, to Japan under arrangements made with and approved by the United States Government and the Military Authorities in Japan; Provided that from the proceeds of such property there shall be retained such amounts as are required to repay advances made by the Government of Canada by way of Repatriation Grant.

The above Japanese when registering with this office, declared no assets or liabilities. He, however, later wrote to this office asking us to collect two amounts owing to him for berry picking:-

Frank Kropoeker	\$7.00
Miss Eva B. Toms	2.50

Kropoeker denied owing the \$7.00 and no reply was received from our letters to Miss Toms. The Japanese was notified of this and advised to make collection direct as we could do nothing further in the matter.

Jutaro NAGATOSHI returned to Japan in October, 1946, and this file needs no further administration and may now be closed.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.

- \* We are in receipt of your communication dated June 26th  
but regret to state that we do not understand just what  
you mean.
- \* In our original letter to you dated August 5th, 1943,  
we asked you to remit the \$7.00 owing to Nagatoshi direct  
to him at the Hastings Park Clearing Station. Kindly advise  
us whether this was done and whether it was paid by cheque,  
money order or cash. Apparently Nagatoshi has not received  
this sum, and the cheque or money order might have been lost  
in the mail, so any information you can supply us will be  
of assistance.
