
Re: Nobuji CHIKASAWA, Reg. 13196

The above Japanese made his declaration to the Custodian on May 15th, 1942 and was evacuated on October 13th, 1942.

The declarant stated that a bed, stove, table and chairs and cooking utensils were left in a 2 roomed house at Mission, B. C.

Our fieldmen checked the property and found only a broken lamp, homemade table and a couch. They were unable to decide whether these articles belonged to CHIKASAWA or to K. SHIKAZE, File 5420. However, a couch was sold at Mission for 70¢ and was credited to SHIKAZE and another one was abandoned.

It was therefore, considered that CHIKASAWA'S effects were not worthy of further consideration.

Dear Sir:

Your file has been reviewed and the following is noted:

You declared that you left a few effects in a small cottage at the rear of 207 7th Street, Mission, B. C. On investigating this place only a few effects of no apparent value were found. A list of these was sent to you on January 8th, 1943.

During the liquidation of Japanese effects these were examined and it was considered that they would not repay the cost of removal and they were therefore, left on the premises.

You declared that a debt of \$42.85 was owing to you by Mr. Deaver. This debt was settled between you and Mr. Deaver and you notified us of this on August 5th, 1944.

You also declared that Mr. YAMADA, Mission, B. C. owed you \$3.00. This debt was settled as of October 1942.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the Protected Area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.


Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:
